Re-set [v. rē-set]

1. to refresh
2. to restore
3. to start anew

For various reasons a church may find the need to push the “reset” button on their ministry. Since Jesus said, “I will build my church” (Matthew 16:18 ^b), maybe there is a need to ask Him to refresh the church’s ministry and start anew.

Characteristics a Church Needs to Reset the Ministry:


- B: Brokenness** – Desperation to do His will.
- U: Unity** – Reaching God’s goals for His Church — together. It’s not about me.
- I: Innovation** – Resetting the ministry to reach people today and tomorrow.
- L: Love** – Loving God leads us to love others and share the Gospel with all.
- D: Dedication** – Get ready to roll up your shirtsleeves! This is hard work.
