Conversation Starter Sheet for Preschool Bible Study Leaders

Development of Preschoolers

Read or recite Luke 2:52. Jesus is our example of growth, maturity and development. Preschoolers are growing, developing and learning at an awesome rate. How can I, as a preschool teacher, help channel their quest for learning toward wisdom (mental development), favor with God (spiritual development) and favor with man (social development)?

What are the characteristics of preschoolers? Take 15 seconds and list the characteristics of the preschoolers in our class.

- Did we include: active, self-focused, curious, creative, sensitive, exploring limits, literal-minded, and has a limited attention span?

Tea Time Tip - The attention span for a preschooler is about one minute per year of age. This means how many minutes for the preschoolers in our class?

- How do we use variety in the class schedule to allow for this limited attention span?
- Do we need to change the schedule to better meet the needs of the preschoolers we teach?
