# ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION of the LOUISIANA BAPTIST CONVENTION

#### ARTICLE I. NAME

The name of this body is the Louisiana Baptist Convention, hereinafter referred to as "Convention."

#### ARTICLE II. DURATION

The duration of this Convention shall be in perpetuity.

#### ARTICLE III. NON-PROFIT CORPORATION

The Convention is a nonprofit corporation organized under the Louisiana Non-Profit Corporation Act, LSA-R.S. 12:201 et seq. and shall have all of the powers, duties, authorizations and responsibilities as provided therein. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Convention shall neither have nor exercise any power, nor engage directly or indirectly in any activity that would invalidate its status as an organization exempt from federal income tax and described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or the corresponding provision or provisions of any subsequent United States Internal Revenue law or laws.

#### ARTICLE IV. PURPOSE

Section 1. The purpose of this Convention is to provide means through which Louisiana Baptist churches and members can cooperate in bringing persons to God throughout the world.

Section 2. The Convention will assist churches and associations in the Christ-appointed tasks: to worship God, to proclaim the Gospel, to teach, to nurture Christians, to establish and strengthen churches, and to minister in Christ's name.

Section 3. This Convention desires to carry its programs forward in fraternal concert with other Baptist groups. This Convention will never exercise authority of any type over such groups.

Section 4. This Convention recognizes the Southern Baptist Convention as the primary instrument used by Baptists to further the cause of Christ on a worldwide basis. The Convention pledges its loyalty and support to the purposes served by the Southern Baptist Convention.

Section 5. This Convention will do all its work in accord with the principle that the Bible is the inspired, inerrant, and infallible Word of God, and is sufficient for all faith and practice, and is truth without any mixture of error in every area of which it speaks (Matthew 22:29).

#### ARTICLE V. REGISTERED OFFICE

The registered office of the Convention shall be located at 1250 MacArthur Drive, Alexandria, Louisiana. The location of the Convention may be changed by an affirmative vote of a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the messengers of the Convention present and voting.

#### ARTICLE VI. MEMBERSHIP

Section 1.This Convention shall be composed of messengers who are members in good standing of Baptist churches cooperating (defined below) with the Convention.

Section 2. This Convention shall be organized on a non-stock basis having messengers as its only members.

Section 3. Each cooperating Baptist church having fifty (50) members, or less, shall be entitled to one (1) messenger; and an additional messenger for each additional fifty (50) members; however, no church shall be entitled to more than fifteen (15) messengers.

Section 4. Messengers shall be certified by their churches to the Convention, but the Convention shall be the final judge of the election and qualifications of its messengers.

Section 5. A cooperating church with the Louisiana Baptist Convention 1) is of like faith and order with Southern Baptists as expressed in the *Baptist Faith and Message* of the Southern Baptist Convention, 2) is sympathetic to the purposes and work of the Convention, 3) contributes to the work of Southern Baptists through the Cooperative Program and 4) has applied for membership in the local association and, upon recommendation by the LBC Committee on Credentials, has been approved to send messengers to the Convention.

Section 6. Any church which has taken action affirming, approving or endorsing the practice of homosexuality shall not be considered as cooperating with this Convention. Such actions include but are not limited to the licensure or ordination of homosexuals, marriage or blessing of homosexual relationships, and endorsing homosexuality as an acceptable lifestyle.

#### ARTICLE VII. TRUSTEES

Section 1. The Convention's management is vested in its Board of Trustees for the execution of legal documents as required by law in effectuation of direction given by and only with the prior approval of the messengers. The Board of Trustees and the Convention shall only act at the direction of and with the prior approval of the messengers. The messengers may delegate authority to officers or committees who shall be accountable to the messengers as provided in the Convention's Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws. The Trustees shall have no authority or powers except those explicitly granted to them by these Articles of Incorporation or in the Convention's Bylaws.

Section 2. The members of the Board of Trustees of the Convention shall be the Convention President, First Vice President, Second Vice President and the Secretary-Treasurer.

#### ARTICLE VIII. OFFICERS

Section 1. The officers of the Convention shall be a president, a first vice president and a second vice president. The office of secretary-treasurer shall be filled ex officio by the executive director of the Executive Board of the Convention.

Section 2. Officers shall be chosen annually from messengers in attendance at the Convention. Nominations shall be from the floor. Election shall be by ballot except when there is a single nominee for an office. In the latter case the president shall instruct the secretary to cast a unanimous ballot for the nominee.<sup>1</sup>

Section 3. Officers shall serve for one (1) year and hold office until their successors are elected and qualified; however, no officers may serve more than two (2) complete successive terms in the same office. Terms of office shall commence at final adjournment of the Convention in session at the time of their election and terminate at final adjournment of the succeeding regular session of the Convention. In case of death, disability of, or other cause making necessary the retirement of the president, the vice presidents shall succeed in order. The Executive Board shall determine when an office is vacant due to the disability of an incumbent.

Section 4. The president shall preside over all deliberations of the Convention and shall perform such other duties as may be customary to the position or as determined in the bylaws or by resolution, and shall, by his election, become an ex officio member of all Convention committees and boards. He shall continue as ex officio member of the Executive Board for one full year immediately following tenure as president of the Convention unless elected to fill a vacancy in the regular membership of the Executive Board.

Section 5. The vice presidents may, in the absence of the president or when requested by the president, preside over the Convention and shall perform such other duties as may be provided in the bylaws or resolutions or as requested by the president.

Section 6. The executive director shall keep accurate and faithful minutes of all sessions of the Convention. He shall cause these to be published in suitable form in the Annual of the Convention together with such other information as the Convention or the Executive Board of the Convention deems necessary and proper.

The Louisiana Baptist Convention has been blessed across the decades with men who have provided excellent leadership in their elected roles as convention officers. A number of qualities have characterized these leaders and form an example and a description of the kind of leaders Louisiana Baptists ought to seek in the future, especially for the highest offices:

<sup>1.</sup> A vital personal relationship with Jesus Christ that includes public and private devotions and holy living.

A belief in the authority and inerrancy of the Bible and agreement with the Convention's confession of faith which is the Baptist Faith and Message 2000.

A desire to see people come to faith in Christ, and an active participation in personal and congregational evangelism.

<sup>4.</sup> A commitment to cooperative missions, especially mission endeavors of Louisiana and Southern Baptists as evidenced by strong congregational support of the Cooperative Program.

A giftedness and experience in leadership that includes the ability to inspire confidence, build consensus, solve problems, and conduct the work of Louisiana Baptists in an orderly and effective manner. (Approved by messengers, LBC, 165th Annual Meeting, 11/13/12)

#### ARTICLE IX. COMMITTEES AND BOARDS OF THE CONVENTION

Section 1. The plan of organization for standing committees and permanent boards of the Convention shall be as established in the bylaws of the Convention.

Section 2. Special committees shall serve for one (1) year or less as provided in the resolutions creating such committees.

Section 3. The members of all standing committees (except the Committee on Committees) and the permanent boards of the Convention shall be elected by the Convention. New members on all boards and committees who fill vacancies developing after annual Convention and before the month of May shall be elected by the Executive Board upon recommendation of the Convention Committee on Nominations or Committee on Committees.

Section 4. The president of the Convention shall appoint the members and the chairman and vice chairman of the Committee on Committees.

Section 5. Boards shall report annually to the Convention in the manner specified by the Executive Board of the Convention unless the Convention itself directs otherwise.

Section 6. Each committee and board of this Convention shall supply the executive director with an official copy of its charter or other legal evidence authorizing its establishment and a copy of its bylaws, as well as copies of the official minutes of their regular and special meetings. The executive director shall maintain these in such fashion that they are readily available to all Louisiana Baptists at the Convention offices of the Executive Board of the Convention.

#### ARTICLE X. THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE CONVENTION

Section 1. The Executive Board of the Convention shall serve as the Convention ad interim, as the Convention's principle advisory committee on total programs, and as the Convention's operating board for the Convention-sponsored general programs and programs not specifically assigned elsewhere.

Section 2. The Executive Board shall consist of one (1) member from each association having a minimum of seven churches with an aggregate church membership of at least one thousand, plus one (1) additional board member from each association having as many as ten thousand (10,000) church members, and an additional board member for each additional five thousand (5,000) church members of such associations; provided, however, that not more than seven (7) members from any one association shall serve simultaneously as members of the Executive Board.

Section 3. The terms of elected Executive Board members shall run for three (3) years. No member may serve continuously for more than two (2) complete successive terms. No member shall be eligible to serve another term until an interval equal to the number of years served shall have elapsed.

Section 4. The membership of any Executive Board member shall be declared vacant if he ceases to be affiliated with a church that is a member of the association from which he was elected.

Section 5. The Convention shall annually elect members to fill all vacancies on the Executive Board. Section 6. The elected officers of the Executive Board of the Convention shall consist of a president and a vice president chosen annually by the membership of the Executive Board. They shall have the duties customarily associated with such positions. The board itself shall elect an executive director for an indefinite term. The executive director shall be ex officio member of the board and serve as its secretary.

Section 7. The Executive Board itself shall determine its time of meeting, organization and method of proceeding subject to these articles and the Convention's bylaws.

Section 8. The Executive Board of the Convention shall report annually to the Convention concerning the total Convention program, the operating programs entrusted to the board, and such other matters as the board deems necessary and proper.

Section 9. The Executive Board of the Convention shall recommend annually to the Convention the appropriation or allocation of undesignated financial resources of the Convention.

Section 10. The Executive Board of the Convention shall serve as the general corporate authority of this Convention. No activity supported by and subject to the will of this Convention shall seek incorporated status in Louisiana or elsewhere without the express approval of this Convention or the Executive Board of this Convention.

#### ARTICLE XI. THE DENOMINATIONAL PAPER

The Baptist Message shall be the official paper of this Convention.

#### ARTICLE XII. MEETINGS

Section 1. The Convention shall meet in regular session in the week following the second Sunday in November unless unusual circumstances should require a change. In such a case, date, time and place shall be determined by the Executive Board.

Section 2. Only the Executive Board of the Louisiana Baptist Convention is authorized to call a special meeting of the Convention and only upon giving churches cooperating with the Convention at least thirty (30) days written notice of the date, place and time of said special meeting which meeting can only be held within the state of Louisiana.

#### ARTICLE XIII. INDEMNIFICATION

To the maximum extent permitted or required by LSA-R.S. 12:227 as it now exists or as it may be amended in the future, the Convention shall indemnify and advance expenses to persons indemnified in §227 for amounts such persons pay directly. The Convention shall not indemnify or advance expenses to such persons for any amount paid by a third party pursuant to a plan or contract of insurance.

#### ARTICLE XV. AGENT FOR SERVICE

The first agent for service of process for the Convention shall be Dr. David E. Hankins. The Board of Trustees may from time to time as it shall determine in its discretion change the agent for service of process for the Convention without the necessity of approval by the messengers.

#### ARTICLE XVI. CONSTRUCTION

All references in these Articles of Incorporation to statutes, regulations, or other sources of legal authority shall refer to the authorities cited, or their successors, as they may be amended from time to time.

#### ARTICLE XVII. AMENDMENTS

Proposed amendments originating in the Executive Board of the Convention are posted to the LBC website and published in one (1) issue of the *Baptist Message* no later than fifteen (15) days before the meeting of the Convention.

#### **BYLAWS**

#### of the

#### LOUISIANA BAPTIST CONVENTION

#### ARTICLE I. PARLIAMENTARY LAW AND CUSTOM

Section 1. *Robert's Rules of Order* shall be recognized as the standard authority to guide the Convention on questions of parliamentary law and custom.

Section 2. One-fourth of the messengers enrolled shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business by the Convention. The minutes of the Convention shall indicate that a quorum was present for all business sessions.

Section 3. No persons addressing the Convention may speak more than twice on the same subject without unanimous consent.

Section 4. The president is charged at all times with the maintenance of decorum and order.

Section 5. All proposed resolutions coming before the Convention shall, prior to consideration by the Convention, be referred to the Committee on Resolutions without debate.

Section 6. All matters of business not scheduled on the agenda shall, prior to consideration by the Convention, be referred to the Committee on Order of Business without debate.

Section 7. The Convention shall express its official position only through its constitution, bylaws, and resolutions. The acceptance of a report shall not, in the absence of implementing resolutions, be construed as authorizing action by Convention committees, boards, and agencies.

# ARTICLE II. PERMANENT PLAN OF ORGANIZATION OF THE CONVENTION AND ITS COMMITTEES AND BOARDS

Permanent organization of the Convention shall be as follows:

- 1. Standing Committees:
  - (1) Committee on Committees
  - (2) Committee on Nominations
  - (3) Committee on Order of Business
  - (4) Committee on Credentials
  - (5) Committee on Resolutions
  - (6) Committee on Moral and Social Concerns
- Boards of Trustees for:
  - (1) Louisiana College
  - (2) Louisiana Baptist Children's Home
  - (3) Louisiana Baptist Foundation
  - (4) The Baptist Message
- 3. Executive Board of the Convention

# ARTICLE III. COMPOSITION AND DUTIES OF COMMITTEES AND BOARDS

Section 1. The composition and duties of boards of trustees of agencies and institutions of this Convention shall be clearly set forth in the Convention resolutions authorizing their establishment and included subsequently in appropriate form in their respective corporate charters. All corporate charters and amendments thereto shall be expressly approved by the Convention or by the Executive Board of the Convention.

Section 2. The **Committee on Committees** shall be composed of nine (9) members one-third of whom shall be appointed each year by the president. This Committee shall nominate to the Convention the membership of all other committees of the Convention and shall nominate or appoint the membership of special committees as instructed by the Convention. The Committee shall also nominate for election the chairman and vice chairman of all Convention committees. Vacancies occurring during the year may be filled by recommendation from this Committee to the Executive Board and may be approved by the Board in any of its regular or special meetings or by mail poll of the Board.

Section 3. The **Committee on Nominations** shall be composed of fifteen (15) members. It shall nominate to the Convention all members of boards of the Convention, including the Executive Board of the Convention. Vacancies on boards occurring prior to the May Executive Board meeting may be filled by recommendation from this Committee to the Executive Board. Vacancies occurring after the May meeting shall be left vacant until the Convention in November.

Section 4. The **Committee on Order of Business** shall be composed of seven (7) members and the person designated to plan the Convention music. It shall present to the opening session of the Convention for adoption a recommended agenda for the Convention sessions. The committee shall recommend to the Convention the preacher and music leader for the Convention meeting one year hence. The committee also may tentatively enlist Bible study leader and major speakers for Conventions scheduled up to three years in advance. The Committee shall be responsible for recommending to the Convention the host, the meeting hall or church, and the dates for the Convention meeting two years hence and, if feasible, for three years hence.

The Committee on Order of Business shall provide periods of time during the convention for the introduction of all matters requiring a vote not scheduled on the agenda, and, when introduced (unless the Convention then gives it unanimous consent for its immediate consideration) shall fix times for the consideration of the same. All such matters of business shall be introduced to the Convention during the time scheduled for Introduction of Business. No such matters of business may be introduced in the last session.

Section 5. The **Committee on Credentials** shall be composed of seven (7) members. It shall supervise the registration and accreditation of messengers to the Convention, and shall manage the application process for congregations desiring to become a cooperating church with the Louisiana Baptist Convention and qualified to send messengers for the first time. It shall recommend to the Convention, when necessary, the disaffiliation of any Louisiana Baptist Convention church that no longer complies with the Convention's definition of a cooperating church. It shall recommend action to the Convention concerning disputes as to status of persons as messengers.

Section 6. The **Committee on Resolutions** shall be composed of seven (7) members and three (3) ex officio members (including the Executive Board president) from the Executive Board of the Convention. The Committee shall be responsible for initiating, reviewing, commenting on, and recommending Convention action on all resolutions. In order to facilitate thorough consideration and to expedite the Committee's work, all proposed resolutions shall:

- Be submitted to the Committee for review and consideration no more than ninety (90) days, but no later than fifteen (15) days, prior to the next LBC annual meeting.
- 2. Be addressed to the Committee on Resolutions in care of the Communications Team of the Louisiana Baptist Convention at its registered or e-mail address (electronic copies are preferred),

- 3. Be typewritten, titled, and dated,
- 4. Be accompanied by a letter from a church qualified to send a messenger to the annual meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention certifying that the person submitting the resolution is a member in good standing, and
- Include complete contact information for both the person submitting it, and his or her church.

No person may submit more than three resolutions per year. The Committee on Resolutions shall prepare and submit to each annual meeting of the Convention only such resolutions the Committee recommends for adoption. Such resolutions may be based upon proposals received by the Committee or may originate with the Committee. Only resolutions recommended by the Committee may be considered by the Convention, except the Convention may, by a 2/3 vote, consider any other resolution properly submitted to the Committee.

Section 7. The **Committee on Moral and Social Concerns** shall be composed of fifteen members. The president of the Convention, the president of the Executive Board, and the editor of the *Baptist Message* shall be ex officio members. The Committee shall identify, study, provide information, and recommend actions on moral and social concerns which need to be of particular concern to Louisiana Baptists. The Committee shall also be authorized to speak publicly and/or conduct campaigns to influence the outcome of current issues on which the Executive Board or the Convention have taken an official position. The Committee may use resource persons and/or organizations in matters of common concern.

Section 8. The **Executive Director of the Executive Board of the Convention** shall serve ex officio as a member and as secretary of all standing committees of the Convention; however, he may be assisted in this task by members of the Executive Board staff.

Section 9. The **financial transactions** of all standing and special committees of the Convention shall be conducted only in accordance with policies and procedures established by the Executive Board of the Convention. The Executive Board shall retain exclusive authority over the custody and disbursement of all funds made available for expenses of committees of the Convention and the Convention itself.

Section 10. **Trustees of corporate boards** established under authority of the Convention shall be responsible for initiating charter amendments whenever such action is necessary to make charter provisions consistent with actions of the Convention.

Section 11. A report of all meetings of boards of the Convention shall be printed in The *Baptist Message* as soon as possible after the meeting with the understanding that specifics concerning financial conditions and personnel relations must often be confidential for the welfare of the institutions and their employees and may be reported in only general terms.

Section 12. Baptist Faith and Message adopted by the Convention on 11/12/02.

#### ARTICLE IV. MEMBERSHIP OF COMMITTEES AND BOARDS

Section 1. The Convention affirms its adherence to the policy of **periodic rotation of the membership** of its committees and boards.

Section 2. The terms of members of boards shall be established as three (3) years. No member elected or appointed for a full term shall be eligible for more than two (2) complete successive terms on the same board. No member elected to serve as much as two (2) years of an unexpired term of any board shall be eligible for more than one (1) successive full term of three (3) years on the same board. A member shall be ineligible to serve on that board until an interval equal to the number of years served on that board shall have elapsed. A person shall not serve in more than one elected or appointed position at a time, unless authorized by the constitution and bylaws. Upon the expiration of the term of any member of a board or committee, no person who is a member of the same church as the person whose term is expiring may serve on that same board or committee until one year following the expiration of the serving member's term.

Membership on all boards and committees collectively shall in all cases be limited to the pastor and up to two (2) other members from any church at any one time. Existing board or committee members who move to a church without an eligible vacancy, shall be rendered ineligible to serve. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, a pastor who resigns his pastorate may continue to serve on the board or committee to which he was elected, provided that the church where he holds membership has an eligible vacancy. No more than one member of the same church may serve on the same board or committee. The terms of members of committees shall be established as three (3) years. No member elected or appointed for a full term or elected to fill an unexpired term shall be eligible to succeed himself until an interval equal to the number of years served on that committee shall have elapsed.

Section 3. As far as practicable, one-third of the membership of each committee or board shall be elected annually.

Section 4. At least one-fourth of the membership of each board shall live outside the association in which the institution is located, and an effort shall be made to have representatives from various areas of the state.

Section 5. All persons regularly elected by the Convention to agencies and boards shall be elected or selected in any convention session except the last session.

Section 6. Each board of the Convention shall organize and elect its own officers under its own rules and regulations. The president of the Convention shall appoint the chairman and vice chairman of the Committee on Committees. That committee shall nominate the chairman and vice chairman of all committees that it nominates to the Convention. Each committee may elect for itself such other officers as it may need.

Section 7. The initial meeting of newly authorized committees shall be called together during or following the Convention by the chairman in conjunction with the secretary of the committee and at such meeting the necessary officers shall be elected.

Section 8. Newly elected members for the first time to standing committees and boards of the Convention shall not be eligible for office within their respective committees or boards prior to the conclusion of one year's service with the committee or board. Ex officio members of standing committees or permanent boards of the Convention shall not hold office on such committees or boards unless specifically authorized to do so by the constitution of the Convention or these bylaws.

Section 9. Officers of committees and boards of this Convention shall be elected annually. Section 10. No salaried employee of this Convention and its boards and committees shall be eligible for election as a voting member of boards or committees of this Convention except as provided in the constitution of the Convention or these bylaws.

Section 11. Boards and committees of this Convention may appoint persons other than members to subcommittees and advisory committees provided such persons shall serve only in an advisory capacity and shall never be permitted to vote at meetings of the authorizing committee or board

# ARTICLE V. INCLUSIONS OF THE CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS OF THE CONVENTION AND THE BYLAWS OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD IN THE ANNUAL OF THE CONVENTION

The directory of the Convention shall include the constitution and bylaws of the Convention and the bylaws of the Executive Board of the Convention in each edition of the Convention's Annual.

#### ARTICLE VI. AVOIDANCE OF ILLEGAL ACTION

No action of the Convention shall be construed as authorizing its committees or boards to take any action that may be contrary to law.

#### ARTICLE VII. AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

These bylaws may be amended at any regular session of the Convention by affirmative vote of two-thirds of the messengers present and voting. Amendments sponsored by the Executive Board shall be posted to the LBC website and published in one (1) issue of the *Baptist Message* no later than fifteen (15) days before the meeting of the Convention.

#### BUSINESS AND FINANCIAL PLAN

#### OF

#### LOUISIANA BAPTIST CONVENTION

#### I. Preliminary Provisions

Each agency and institution of the Convention shall submit to the Business and Finance Committee of the Executive Board (1) an itemized estimate of its receipts for the next fiscal year, and (2) an itemized estimate of its expenditures for the next fiscal year.

The Executive Board shall recommend to the Convention a budget based on an analysis of the aforementioned data, which budget shall include allocations to agencies and institutions. "Agencies" shall include the *Baptist Message*, Louisiana Baptist Foundation, and the Executive Board. "Institutions" shall include Louisiana Baptist Children's Home, and Louisiana College.

The Budget and Financial Data Query Form shall include itemized estimates of receipts and expenditures for a three-year period, past, present and projected, as indicated in the report form

#### II. Fiscal Periods

Except where agreement otherwise is effected between an agency or institution and the Executive Board, the financial affairs of the Convention and all agencies or institutions owned, operated and controlled by the Louisiana Baptist Convention, shall be operated on the calendar year.

#### III. Disbursement of Monetary Funds

The executive director shall disburse all monies in accordance with the provisions of the Convention budget. Exceptions to this must have Convention approval.

Each agency or institution of the Convention is hereby instructed and ordered to keep all trust funds and/or designated gifts (for they are trust funds) sacred to the trust or the designation involved, and that they be kept separate from all other funds of such agency or institution.

Disbursement of Cooperative Program and Designated funds will be made immediately after closing of the books and in no event shall they be made later than the 10th of each month.

Inasmuch as each church is an autonomous body it has the inherent right, as is of course true with each individual, to make designations as desired. When a designated gift is received at the Baptist Building Business Office it shall be recorded and the gift will be forwarded forthwith to the designated object or person. An exception is that any gift received by any Louisiana Baptist Convention entity from a church that affirms, approves, or endorses homosexual behavior shall be returned to the donor. The acceptance and disbursement of any gifts shall not be construed as endorsement or agreement with the beliefs and practices of the donor.

Allocations for agencies and institutions from the Cooperative Program shall be determined on the basis of church gifts to the Cooperative Program and church designations the previous year and on the basis of needs and requirements of institutions and agencies as evaluated by the Business and Finance Committee and the Executive Board with recommended allocations to be voted by the Convention each year.

In the event that Cooperative Program receipts are less than the budget, distribution of funds to the respective agencies and institutions will be made on the basis of budget percentage of actual receipts.

#### IV. Special Solicitations

Any special campaigns for funds by an agency or institution owned, controlled, or supported by the Convention, must first secure the endorsement and approval of the Executive Board and the Convention. This is not to be construed as prohibiting any agency or institution from approaching individuals or corporations for gifts, it being understood that such approach to an individual or corporation is to be made only by personal contact or personal correspondence.

#### V. Capital Investments and Liabilities

Without the approval of the Convention or Executive Board, no liability or indebtedness exceeding \$100,000 or 2% of a Convention entity's annual operating budget (whichever is greater), shall be incurred by a Convention entity other than those that can be repaid from anticipated receipts for operating purposes and/or capital needs within a period of three years from the date such obligations were incurred. A report on all entity indebtedness shall be made to the Executive Board annually.

#### VI. Emergency Reserves

Each agency and institution of this Convention shall set up a reserve for contingencies to provide for deficits that may occur either through decreased receipts or through emergencies. The goal shall be that all agencies/institutions move immediately to accumulate funds in their operating reserve to 30 days operation within a long-term goal of at least three months.

#### VII. Financial Reports

Each agency and institution of the Convention shall close its books and accounts, and have them audited by a Certified Public Accountant as of the close of its fiscal year, and in turn shall forward two copies of its audit to the executive director as soon as available. These audits are to be studied by the Business and Finance Committee of the Executive Board, and shall include the following:

- 1) Balance Sheet
- 2) Analysis of surplus accounts
- 3) Income and expense
- 4) Classified list of investments by fund and type of investment
- 5) Receipts:
  - (a) Cooperative receipts
  - (b) Designated receipts
  - (c) Other income

Each agency and institution shall submit a report on the Budget and Financial Data form on or before June 1 of each year. A balance sheet of the financial condition after May 31 and prior to September 1 of the current year shall be submitted for publication in the current *Book of Reports* and Annual.

#### VIII. Handling of Funds

All persons who handle funds or securities for any agency or institution shall be adequately bonded. Discretion shall be exercised in the handling of all securities, deeds, notes and other valuable records (legal documents), and there must always be express authority from the proper source for such handling.

#### IX. Additional Agencies and Institutions

No new agency or institution shall be authorized by this Convention except after thorough study and presentation to the Convention for favorable action in two succeeding annual meetings.

#### X. Business Procedure

Each agency and institution of the Louisiana Baptist Convention as a normal operating

policy shall refrain from entering any business transaction with a trustee or employee, or a business enterprise in which a trustee or employee has an interest. An exception to this policy may be made, at the discretion of the board of trustees, in any case wherein it appears that a commodity or service at the discretion of the board, is found to be in the best interest of the agency or institution. Competitive bids should be taken if practicable. In any case being considered for exception, the extent of the trustees' or employees' interest shall be disclosed to the entire board.

#### XI. Professional Services

The Executive Board at its discretion may employ an auditor to study the audited report with the auditors of the agencies and institutions in the light of Convention instructions.

The Executive Board at its discretion may employ an engineer or architect to study proposed capital projects or maintenance of present capital assets.

#### XII. Amendments

This Business and Financial Plan may be altered by two-thirds of the messengers present and voting at any time except during the last session (of the Convention), provided that recommended changes shall have been presented to the Executive Board and published in the *Baptist Message* at least one month in advance of the Convention.

# ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE LOUISIANA BAPTIST CONVENTION

#### ARTICLE I

The name of this corporation shall be THE EXECUTIVE BOARD OF THE LOUISIANA BAPTIST CONVENTION, and under this name it shall have authority to sue and be sued; to have and to make a corporate seal; to own property both real and personal, and to receive the same by purchase, gift or any other process known to the law, to borrow money in its corporate name and to mortgage and hypothecate its property to secure the same, and generally to do, and to perform all acts necessary for the purposes for which it is created.

The corporate existence of this corporation shall be in perpetuity, unless sooner dissolved by a two-thirds vote of this corporation, which vote shall be taken not less than six months after receiving instructions to that effect in writing from the LOUISIANA BAPTIST CONVENTION.

#### ARTICLE II

The objects and purposes of this corporation shall be to foster Missions, at home and abroad, Christian Education and Benevolences, to promote and give direction to the work of the Louisiana Baptist Convention in these fields of service, through its several institutions and departments of service, necessary to the accomplishment of its objects and purposes, and to promote harmony of feeling and concert of action in adopting and carrying into operation such measures as may promote the Redeemer's Kingdom in Louisiana and in the regions beyond. It shall have power and authority to do all things necessary to carry out the objects and purposes for which it is organized."

#### ARTICLE III

The Executive Board shall consist of one (1) member from each association, having a minimum of seven churches with an aggregate church membership of at least one thousand, plus one (1) additional board member from each association having as many as ten thousand (10,000) church members, and an additional board member for each additional five thousand (5,000) church members of such associations; provided, however that not more than seven (7) members from any one association shall serve simultaneously as members of the Executive Board."

The terms of elected board members shall run for three (3) years. No member may serve continuously for more than two (2) complete successive terms. No member shall be eligible to serve another term until an interval equal to the number of years served shall have elapsed.

The membership of any board member shall be declared vacant if he ceases to be affiliated with a church that is a member of the association from which he was elected.

The Convention shall annually elect members to fill all vacancies in the board.

"The qualifications, term of office and criteria for selection of persons to serve as a member of the Executive Board of this corporation shall be in conformity with Article X. The Executive Board of the Convention contained in the Articles of Incorporation of the Louisiana Baptist Convention and Article IV. Membership of Committees And Boards contained in the Bylaws of the Louisiana Baptist Convention and any future amendments thereto. In addition to vacancies described in the Articles of Incorporation and By-laws of the Louisiana Baptist Convention, the death or resignation of a member of the Executive Board shall automatically and immediately cause that office to become vacant without the necessity of any further action. Any other vacancy in the office of member of the Executive Board of this corporation for any reason deemed sufficient by the member shall only be declared by a two-thirds majority affirmative vote of the

messengers to the Louisiana Baptist Convention and only after the affirmative recommendation of the Convention Committee on Nominations has been published in the *BAPTIST MESSAGE* not less than twice in the thirty days immediately preceding the meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention."

#### ARTICLE IV

The elected officers of the Executive Board of the Convention shall consist of a president and a vice president chosen annually by the membership of the Executive Board. They shall have the duties customarily associated with such positions. The board itself shall elect an executive director for an indefinite term. The executive director shall be ex officio member of the board and serve as its secretary.

The first officers of this corporation shall be as follows to wit: George W. Bolton, President, H. A. Sumrell, Vice-President; H. H. Webb, Recording Secretary; W. N. Johnson, Corresponding Secretary; B. F. Thompson, Treasurer; and H. H. Webb, Auditor, who shall hold office until their successors are elected.

#### ARTICLE V

This corporation shall have the authority to adopt such rules and bylaws, not contrary to law, or the provisions of this charter, as it deems proper, and to appoint all necessary committees to carry out the purposes for which this corporation was organized.

#### ARTICLE VI

The domicile of this corporation shall be at Alexandria, Rapides Parish, Louisiana, and the service of all legal process shall be made at the domicile of the corporation, upon the President, or in his absence upon the Vice President, or in the absence of both of these, upon the Executive Director/Secretary, and otherwise according to law.

#### ARTICLE VII

This corporation shall not issue any stock certificates, and the private property of the members of this corporation shall not be held liable for any of the debts of the corporation, nor shall any mere formality in the drawing of this charter have the effect of rendering it null.

#### ARTICLE VIII

The Articles of Incorporation may only be amended with the approval of two-thirds majority of the Executive Board and the approval of two-thirds majority of the membership at the annual meeting, six months notice having been given prior to the annual convention to the President of the Louisiana Baptist Convention, and also notice of the proposed amendments having been published in the *Baptist Message* for three consecutive weeks preceding the annual meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention.

#### ARTICLE IX

This Corporation shall be organized on a non-stock membership basis. The sole member of this corporation shall be the Louisiana Baptist Convention, a nonprofit, Louisiana Corporation domiciled in Alexandria, Louisiana. Except as otherwise provided in these Articles of Incorporation

or by applicable law requiring a greater number of votes other than a simple majority for approval of any action by the member, any matter requiring a vote of the member of this corporation shall be adopted by a majority of messengers who are present and voting as is provided by the Louisiana Baptist Convention Articles of Incorporation. Each messenger shall have one vote."

#### ARTICLE X.

The annual meeting of the member of this corporation shall take place contemporaneously with the annual meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention without the necessity of giving notice to the member of said meeting. Any special meeting of the member of this corporation may only be called as provided in *Article XII Meetings* of the Louisiana Baptist Convention's Articles of Incorporation and shall only be held at the same places, dates and times as the Louisiana Baptist Convention determines in accordance with its Articles of Incorporation and By-laws. Notice of any special meeting of the member of this corporation shall be published in the *BAPTIST MESSAGE* not less than twice in thirty days immediately preceding the meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention."

#### ARTICLE XI.

Before any dissolution or merger of this corporation, transfer or sale of substantially all of this corporation's assets and/or the formation of other corporations, limited liability companies or other forms of doing business by this corporation may be implemented, the proposed action shall be approved by the member by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the messengers present and voting and only after the resolution authorizing the action has been published in the *BAPTIST MESSAGE* not less than twice in the thirty days immediately preceding the meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention."

#### **BYLAWS**

#### of the

#### EXECUTIVE BOARD

#### of the

#### LOUISIANA BAPTIST CONVENTION

#### ARTICLE I. GENERAL FUNCTIONS

Section 1. It is the function of the Executive Board to perform such duties and responsibilities as may be authorized by the Louisiana Baptist Convention, including serving as the Convention ad interim, serving as the Convention's principal adviser on total program, and administering programs entrusted to it by the Convention or not expressly assigned to another board or committee by the Convention. The Executive Board shall, by resolution, enumerate its specific duties and responsibilities under these general delegations of responsibility by the Convention.

Section 2. Duties and responsibilities of this board as set forth in the constitution and bylaws of the Convention shall be construed as incorporated in these bylaws. The board shall at no time authorize action contrary to instructions of the Convention.

# ARTICLE II. PERMANENT PLAN OF ORGANIZATION OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. The plan of organization of the Executive Board, its committees and staff, shall be as follows:

- 1. The elected officers of the Executive Board of the Convention shall consist of a president and a vice president chosen annually by the membership of the Executive Board at the Pre-Convention Board meeting. They shall have the duties customarily associated with such positions. The board itself shall elect an executive director for an indefinite time. The executive director shall be an ex officio member of the board and serve as its secretary.
  - 2. Standing committees of the Executive Board
    - (1) Nominating Committee
    - (2) Administrative Committee
    - (3) Business and Finance Committee
    - (4) Executive Committee
    - (5) Missions Support Committee
    - (6) Properties Committee
  - 3. Subsidiary of the Executive Board: Church Site Corporation

#### ARTICLE III. MEETINGS

Section 1. The Executive Board shall hold regular meetings in May, September, and immediately prior to the convening of the annual Convention. The May meeting shall be on the first Tuesday. The September meeting shall be on the last Tuesday. Should unusual circumstances require a change in the meeting dates, the Executive Committee may recommend such a change for approval by the board at a regular meeting or by means of a mail poll. The board may, by resolution, hold such other meetings as it deems necessary and desirable.

Section 2. The Executive Committee of the board may, for reasons that seem to it good and proper, call the board to special meetings.

Section 3. Fifty-one percent (51%) of the elected membership of the board shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of business. The minutes shall always indicate the presence of a quorum at the openings of any business session.

Section 4. Notification of or an explanation of absence from meetings of the board should be given by members to the chairman or secretary.

## ARTICLE IV. COMPOSITION, DUTIES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF COMMITTEES

Section 1. Committees authorized in Article II of these bylaws shall be primarily advisory in nature. The Executive Board may, however, delegate responsibility to a committee to act in the name of the board for specifically defined purposes.

Section 2. Committee members shall serve for three year terms with one-third of the membership rotating annually.

Section 3. No member may serve on more than two (2) standing committees, except the Executive Committee, simultaneously.

Section 4. The president of the board shall be an ex officio member of all committees, subcommittees and advisory committees. He shall hold no elective committee position. A committee chairman shall also be an ex officio member of subcommittees and advisory committees created and authorized by and for the committee.

Section 5. The executive director of the board shall serve ex officio as a member and as secretary of each committee. He may, however, appoint assistant secretaries from the Executive Board staff to assist him in the discharge of secretarial duties.

Section 6. All standing committees, except the Executive Committee and the Nominating Committee, shall consist of fifteen (15) or more elected members subject to the discretion of the board

Section 7. Each committee shall be responsible for reporting to the Executive Board at each regular board meeting and for formulating its respective portion of the board's annual report to the Convention

Section 8. All committees shall be of equal status with each committee reporting directly to the Executive Board; however, this shall not be construed as barring the submission by the Administrative Committee of requests for unallocated funds directly to the Business and Finance Committee or forbidding in any way cooperation among committees on common problems.

Section 9. The committees, themselves, shall determine the time, place, and frequency of their meetings unless the Executive Board directs otherwise.

Section 10. The executive director will maintain minutes of all official meetings of the board and its committees. These shall be available at the Executive Offices of the Executive Board.

Section 11. Standing committees of this board are authorized to create and utilize such subcommittees or advisory committees as may be necessary to the proper performance of their duties. A list of all such subcommittees or advisory committees and their membership shall be submitted to, and included in, the official minutes of the Executive Board. Persons other than elected members of the Executive Board may be utilized by the committee to render qualified service as advisory, nonvoting members on subcommittees and advisory committees.

Section 12. The **Nominating Committee** shall consist of nine (9) members appointed by the president of the Executive Board. One-third of the committee shall be appointed annually, subsequent to the meeting of the Convention but prior to the September meeting of the Executive Board. The Nominating Committee shall recommend assignment of Executive Board members to other standing committees of the board and shall also recommend officers for these committees.

Section 13. The responsibilities of the **Business and Finance Committee** shall be to advise and assist the Executive Board in recommending both long-range and short-range goals for the Convention; in recommending the allocations of undesignated resources of the Convention to its

respective agencies and institutions; and in recommending and appraising the financial policies and practices of the Convention and of its agencies and institutions.

Section 14. The **Administrative Committee's** principal function shall be to advise and assist the Executive Board in carrying out the program assigned by the Convention to the board for administration. The committee shall recommend plans of organization and general policies to the Executive Board for approval and shall itself review and approve administrative policies and actions as appropriate. The executive director shall report to the Executive Board through this committee. In the event of a vacancy in this position, this committee shall be the channel through which a successor shall be recommended to the Executive Board. The committee shall review and approve the budget proposals of the executive director concerning Executive Board programs and shall recommend to the Business and Finance Committee any desired allocation of undesignated funds. The committee shall also serve the Executive Board by having cognizance of such administrative problems as the board itself may have, including financial and administrative matters relating to standing and special committees of the Convention.

Section 15. The **Missions Support Committee** shall review and approve funds for mission budget supplements, church loans, and special requests from missions for financial assistance.

Section 16. The **Properties Committee** shall study and recommend property acquisition, sale, or lease, study and recommend insurance coverage on properties owned or leased by Executive Board, and study and recommend major building project(s) or renovation.

Section 17. The **Executive Committee** shall consist of the President and Vice President of the Executive Board, who shall serve as chairman and vice chairman respectively of the Executive Committee, plus the chairmen of the other five standing committees of the board. The Executive Committee's sole responsibility shall be to advise and assist the Executive board in carrying out its function as the convention ad interim to the extent this function is specifically delegated by the Convention. The committee shall not in any instance serve as a substitute for, or insert its judgment in lieu of that of the other standing committees of the board; nor shall it review of appraise the work of the other committees unless expressly so directed by the Executive Board. The Executive Committee shall have the duty of conducting the Executive Director's Annual Performance Review and recommending any adjustment to the Executive Director's compensation and benefits.

Section 18. The Executive Board may by resolution define more specifically the duties and responsibilities of its committees; provided, however, that duties and responsibilities contained in these bylaws shall be changed only through amendment of these bylaws.

#### ARTICLE V. THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR-TREASURER

Section 1. The executive director shall serve as the chief executive officer of the staff of the Executive Board. He shall be responsible for providing executive direction and leadership to all programs assigned to the Executive Board. The Administrative Committee shall determine in writing the specific responsibilities of the executive director; however, the committee itself shall not assume any executive or administrative functions.

Section 2. The executive director shall serve as the principal professional adviser and principal staff assistant to the Executive Board and all of its committees. In performing this function, the executive director is expected and directed to utilize all talents available to the Convention to the end that the Executive Board may be provided with the best possible assistance and advice.

Section 3. The executive director shall approve the employment of all Executive Board personnel. The employment procedures shall be in accordance with policies of the Executive Board.

Section 4. The executive director shall maintain on a current basis a policy manual and an organization manual that reflect the principal policies of the Convention and its general plan of organization. The manuals shall also include the principal policies and general plan of the organization of the Executive Board.

Section 5. When the office of the Executive Director becomes vacant, a successor shall be

elected by the Executive Board of the Louisiana Baptist Convention. The name of the successor shall be recommended to the Board by a Search Committee comprised of the members of the Executive Committee and the Nominating Committee of the Board. The Search Committee shall be convened by the President of the Board upon the vacancy in the office or upon the notice by the Executive Director to vacate the office. The Search Committee will elect its own chairman, and once convened, will serve until the election of an Executive Director. However, the Executive Board, with proper notice and a two-thirds affirmative vote, may fill the office of the Executive Director at any meeting of the board without a recommendation from the Search Committee.

#### ARTICLE VI. AMENDMENTS

These bylaws may be amended at any meeting of the Executive Board provided:

- 1. Committee-sponsored amendments are announced at the preceding meeting of the board or published in the *Baptist Message* at least one month in advance of the board meeting at which they are considered.
  - 2. Amendments from the floor are proposed at one meeting and acted upon at the next meeting.
  - 3. Amendments to carry must receive a two-thirds vote of those present and voting.

#### LOUISIANA BAPTIST CONVENTION CHURCH SITE PLAN

#### I. PREAMBLE

That Louisiana Baptist Convention has been involved with churches and associations in the starting of new churches since its organization in 1848. The leaders of the Convention have been aware for some time that there was a need for some organization that could act promptly and efficiently in the matter of acquiring new church sites for developing new churches and missions. Accordingly, the following plan has been developed after thorough and open discussions of the matter by related staff persons, appropriate committees and subcommittees of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board, qualified lay persons in the fields of real estate, business, finance, and new churches.

#### II. ORGANIZATION

#### **Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation**

The Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation is a wholly-owned, non-profit, subsidiary corporation of the Executive Board, Louisiana Baptist Convention.

#### Purpose

The purpose shall be to assist Louisiana churches, associations, and the Louisiana Baptist Convention in the acquisitions of church sites for new Louisiana Baptist churches. The Church Site Corporation may purchase, receive, and otherwise acquire real and personal property for the establishment of new churches and missions, and to assist churches and associations related to the Louisiana Baptist Convention in acquiring real and personal property for the establishment of new churches and missions.

#### **Membership and Participation**

- 1. The membership of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation shall be the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board.
- 2. The Board of Directors of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation shall be elected by the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board upon recommendation of the Nominating Committee of the Executive Board.
- 3. Participation in the Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation shall be open to all persons interested in the development of new churches and missions in Louisiana.
  - (1) Participation shall be by donation of a share(s) of donation.
  - (2) Donor of a share or more shall be entitled to receive:
    - a. A donation share certificate stating the number of shares donated. These shares may be donated in the name of the donor, a family member, some other person or a memorial to a deceased person.
    - A quarterly newsletter presenting the status, actions, and plans of the Church Site Corporation.
    - c. A copy of the annual financial statement of the Church Site Corporation.
  - 4. Relationship to Louisiana Baptist Convention Business and Financial Plan.

The Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation shall conduct its business, activities, programs, and projects subject to the Louisiana Baptist Convention Business and Financial Plan.

#### III. FUNDING

#### Sources of Capital Funds

- 1. Capital funds for the corpus of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation shall be obtained by the receipt of donations for donation shares by individuals, churches, associations, businesses, foundations, and others interested in the development of new churches. The Church Site Corporation shall have the power to receive donation shares in the amount of 50,000 shares at \$25.00 per share initially. Subsequently, after the initial 50,000 shares have been donated, approval for additional shares must be secured from the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board
- 2. The Church Site Corporation shall be responsible for administering the Mission Land Fund of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board. The corpus of the Mission Land Fund is to be transferred to the Church Site Corporation upon its activation on January 1, 1980. The Church Site Corporation shall have the responsibility of establishing policies and guidelines for this fund
- 3. The Church Site Corporation shall be empowered by the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board to borrow money provided the Church Site Corporation can repay any and all loans with its own sources and does not require repayment of loans from Executive Board funds.
- 4. The Church Site Corporation may use its earnings from interest income, profits from property dealings, gifts, bequests and donations, unless otherwise specified by the donor, to increase the corpus of the Corporation.

#### Sources of Grant Funds

- 1. The Church Site Corporation may seek and receive gifts, bequests, and donations of certain monies or real or personal properties to be used as grants to churches and associations to assist in the acquisition of new church sites.
- 2. The Corporation may request and receive allocations for its grant program from the Georgia Barnette State Mission Offering.
- 3. The Corporation may request and receive allocations from the Louisiana Baptist Convention Cooperative Program Budget to be used in its grant program.
- 4. The Corporation may use the earnings from its interest income, profits from property dealings, gifts, bequests, and donations, unless otherwise specified by the donor, for its grant program.

#### IV. GUIDELINES

#### Nama

The name of this plan shall be the Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Plan and the name of the organization shall be the Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation.

#### Responsibility

The Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation shall be responsible to plan and conduct the affairs of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Plan as adopted by the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board and the Louisiana Baptist Convention and as revised from time to time by the Executive Board.

#### Nomination and Election of Board of Directors

The Church Site Corporation shall consist of nine (9) members elected by the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board upon recommendation of the Executive Board Nominating Committee, and four (4) ex officio members.

1. The Board of Directors shall be composed of nine (9) elected members and four (4) ex officio members as follows:

- a. Six (6) mission-minded persons (usually lay persons) experienced in finance, business or real estate, representing different areas of Louisiana.
- b. Three (3) mission-minded church staff members with experience in real estate and new churches, if possible.
- c. Four (4) ex officio members, the Louisiana Baptist Convention president, the chairman of the Executive Board, the chairman of the Missions Support Committee and the Executive Director.
  - 2. Nominations to be developed in accordance with the procedures of the Executive Board.
- 3. The elected members of the Board of Directors shall serve for three years, and be eligible to serve a second three-year term. (In the beginning some members should be elected for three, four, and five-year terms in order to establish the rotation system.)

#### Officers

The officers of the Corporation shall consist of a president, vice president, and recording secretary. The recording secretary shall be the Executive Director of the Louisiana Baptist Convention or his designate.

The general counsel for the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board shall serve as legal advisor of the Corporation.

#### **Meetings of the Board of Directors**

The meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held in the Baptist Building, Alexandria, or in such place as may be designated by the Board of Directors or its officers. The Board of Directors shall meet at least twice each year, and as often as necessary to carry on the business of the Corporation. The President shall have the authority to call a meeting of the Board of Directors when it is deemed expedient to do so.

A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

#### **Duties of the Board of Directors**

The Board shall meet at stated times for the purpose of conducting the affairs of the Corporation. It shall also be the responsibility of the Board to make or have made certain studies of population and other data to establish trends and needs for new churches. The Board shall make decisions related to acquiring new church sites based upon demographic data, land surveys, appraisals, zoning, evidence of good title, legal description of the property, participation of local forces in the financing of the project, maintenance of the property, program evaluation, priority of the new work, available funds or other such information that the Board may require.

It is anticipated that the field work and studies shall be done by appropriate staff members of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board whose program assignments relate to new churches.

The Board shall also make regular reports of its work and actions to the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board.

#### **Authority of the Board of Directors**

- 1. The Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation shall have authority under its own charter to purchase, subdivide, sell, lease, rent, exchange, donate, and finance the purchase and/or sale of real and personal property to be used for purposes consistent with its stated program.
- 2. The Corporation shall have the authority to loan, or make grants to churches and associations related to the Louisiana Baptist Convention, so long as it does not diminish its corpus funds; terms of the loans and grants shall be established by the Board of Directors of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Church Site Corporation.
- 3. It shall be the duty and responsibility of the Corporation to actively seek out priority and strategic church sites in all areas of Louisiana.

- 4. The Corporation shall discuss and utilize the services of the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board and staff persons of the Executive Board assigned to work with the development of new churches.
- 5. All properties purchased by the Church Site Corporation shall be held in the name of the Corporation.

#### **Working Arrangements**

- 1. The Board of Directors shall work with appropriate program leaders on the staff of the Executive Board in carrying out this work. It shall also be responsible to work with local churches and associations in the acquisition of new church sites. If it is not feasible to work with local Baptist leaders, the Board may proceed as necessary.
- 2. Any properties given to the Louisiana Baptist Convention through the Church Site Corporation shall be given without restrictions, except as agreed upon by the Board of Directors.
- 3. A local Baptist Church cooperating with the Louisiana Baptist Convention and the local association shall have the responsibility of sponsoring each new mission. It will be the normal procedure for the Board of Directors to have in hand a plan for each new church site, before it is purchased.
- 4. When new church sites are conveyed to sponsoring churches, certain stipulations shall be made to the church by the Board of Directors as follows:
- a. The sponsoring church may not change the agreed upon financial plan for development without first consulting the Board of Directors.
- b. The sponsoring church shall inform the mission church of the financial contributions made by the Church Site Corporation, the association and the sponsoring church in the acquisition of the property.
- c. It shall be the sponsoring church's responsibility to enter into an agreement with its mission and the Louisiana Baptist Convention whereby any monies given or granted by the Corporation will be returned should such mission, or mission and sponsoring church, or mission after it is constituted as a church, disassociates itself from the Louisiana Baptist Convention. A recommended instrument shall be provided by the Church Site Corporation.
- 5. The Business Division office of the Louisiana Baptist Convention will be responsible to provide accounting and other business services to the Church Site Corporation.

#### Revisions

The provision of this document may be revised or amended by the Louisiana Baptist Convention Executive Board at any regular or special meeting of the Executive Board, acting on the recommendation of appropriate committees of the Executive Board.

#### BAPTIST FAITH AND MESSAGE Adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention, June 14, 2000

The 1999 session of the Southern Baptist Convention, meeting in Atlanta, Georgia, adopted the following motion addressed to the President of the Convention:

"I move that in your capacity as Southern Baptist Convention chairman, you appoint a blue ribbon committee to review the *Baptist Faith and Message* statement with the responsibility to report and bring any recommendations to this meeting next June in Orlando."

President Paige Patterson appointed the committee as follows: Max Barnett (OK), Steve Gaines (AL), Susie Hawkins (TX), Rudy A. Hernandez (TX), Charles S. Kelley, Jr. (LA), Heather King (IN), Richard D. Land (TN), Fred Luter (LA), R. Albert Mohler, Jr. (KY), T. C. Pinckney (VA), Nelson Price (GA), Adrian Rogers (TN), Roger Spradlin (CA), Simon Tsoi (AZ), Jerry Vines (FL). Adrian Rogers (TN) was appointed chairman.

Your committee thus constituted begs leave to present its report as follows:

Baptists are a people of deep beliefs and cherished doctrines. Throughout our history we have been a confessional people, adopting statements of faith as a witness to our beliefs and a pledge of our faithfulness to the doctrines revealed in Holy Scripture.

Our confessions of faith are rooted in historical precedent, as the church in every age has been called upon to define and defend its beliefs. Each generation of Christians bears the responsibility of guarding the treasury of truth that has been entrusted to us [2 Timothy 1:14]. Facing a new century, Southern Baptists must meet the demands and duties of the present hour.

New challenges to faith appear in every age. A pervasive anti-supernaturalism in the culture was answered by Southern Baptists in 1925, when the *Baptist Faith and Message* was first adopted by this Convention. In 1963, Southern Baptists responded to assaults upon the authority and truthfulness of the Bible by adopting revisions to the *Baptist Faith and Message*. The Convention added an article on "The Family" in 1998, thus answering cultural confusion with the clear teachings of Scripture. Now, faced with a culture hostile to the very notion of truth, this generation of Baptists must claim anew the eternal truths of the Christian faith.

Your committee respects and celebrates the heritage of the *Baptist Faith and Message*, and affirms the decision of the Convention in 1925 to adopt the *New Hampshire Confession of Faith*, "revised at certain points and with some additional articles growing out of certain needs . . . ." We also respect the important contributions of the 1925 and 1963 editions of the *Baptist Faith and Message*.

With the 1963 committee, we have been guided in our work by the 1925 "statement of the historic Baptist conception of the nature and function of confessions of faith in our religious and denominational life . . . ." It is, therefore, quoted in full as a part of this report to the Convention:

- (1) That they constitute a consensus of opinion of some Baptist body, large or small, for the general instruction and guidance of our own people and others concerning those articles of the Christian faith which are most surely held among us. They are not intended to add anything to the simple conditions of salvation revealed in the New Testament, viz., repentance toward God and faith in Jesus Christ as Saviour and Lord.
- (2) That we do not regard them as complete statements of our faith, having any quality of finality or infallibility. As in the past so in the future, Baptists should hold themselves free to revise their statements of faith as may seem to them wise and expedient at any time.
- (3) That any group of Baptists, large or small, have the inherent right to draw up for themselves and publish to the world a confession of their faith whenever they may think it advisable to do so.

- (4) That the sole authority for faith and practice among Baptists is the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments. Confessions are only guides in interpretation, having no authority over the conscience.
- (5) That they are statements of religious convictions, drawn from the Scriptures, and are not to be used to hamper freedom of thought or investigation in other realms of life.

Baptists cherish and defend religious liberty, and deny the right of any secular or religious authority to impose a confession of faith upon a church or body of churches. We honor the principles of soul competency and the priesthood of believers, affirming together both our liberty in Christ and our accountability to each other under the Word of God.

Baptist churches, associations, and general bodies have adopted confessions of faith as a witness to the world, and as instruments of doctrinal accountability. We are not embarrassed to state before the world that these are doctrines we hold precious and as essential to the Baptist tradition of faith and practice.

As a committee, we have been charged to address the "certain needs" of our own generation. In an age increasingly hostile to Christian truth, our challenge is to express the truth as revealed in Scripture, and to bear witness to Jesus Christ, who is "the Way, the Truth, and the Life."

The 1963 committee rightly sought to identify and affirm "certain definite doctrines that Baptists believe, cherish, and with which they have been and are now closely identified." Our living faith is established upon eternal truths. "Thus this generation of Southern Baptists is in historic succession of intent and purpose as it endeavors to state for its time and theological climate those articles of the Christian faith which are most surely held among us."

It is the purpose of this statement of faith and message to set forth certain teachings which we believe.

#### THE BAPTIST FAITH & MESSAGE

#### I. THE SCRIPTURES

The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is God's revelation of Himself to man. It is a perfect treasure of divine instruction. It has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth, without any mixture of error, for its matter. Therefore, all Scripture is totally true and trustworthy. It reveals the principles by which God judges us, and therefore is, and will remain to the end of the world, the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and religious opinions should be tried. All Scripture is a testimony to Christ, who is Himself the focus of divine revelation.

#### II. GOD

There is one and only one living and true God. He is an intelligent, spiritual, and personal Being, the Creator, Redeemer, Preserver, and Ruler of the universe. God is infinite in holiness and all other perfections. God is all powerful and all knowing; and His perfect knowledge extends to all things, past, present, and future, including the future decisions of His free creatures. To Him we owe the highest love, reverence, and obedience. The eternal triune God reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, with distinct personal attributes, but without division of nature, essence, or being.

#### A. GOD THE FATHER

God as Father reigns with providential care over His universe, His creatures, and the flow of the stream of human history according to the purposes of His grace. He is all powerful, all knowing, all loving, and all wise. God is Father in truth to those who become children of God through faith in Jesus Christ. He is fatherly in His attitude toward all men.

#### B. GOD THE SON

Christ is the eternal Son of God. In His incarnation as Jesus Christ He was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. Jesus perfectly revealed and did the will of God, taking upon Himself human nature with its demands and necessities and identifying Himself completely with mankind yet without sin. He honored the divine law by His personal obedience, and in His substitutionary death on the cross He made provision for the redemption of men from sin. He was raised from the dead with a glorified body and appeared to His disciples as the person who was with them before His crucifixion. He ascended into heaven and is now exalted at the right hand of God where He is the One Mediator, fully God, fully man, in whose Person is effected the reconciliation between God and man. He will return in power and glory to judge the world and to consummate His redemptive mission. He now dwells in all believers as the living and ever present Lord.

#### C. GOD THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God, fully divine. He inspired holy men of old to write the Scriptures. Through illumination He enables men to understand truth. He exalts Christ. He convicts men of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment. He calls men to the Saviour, and effects regeneration. At the moment of regeneration He baptizes every believer into the Body of Christ. He cultivates Christian character, comforts believers, and bestows the spiritual gifts by which they serve God through His church. He seals the believer unto the day of final redemption. His presence in the Christian is the guarantee that God will bring the believer into the fullness of the stature of Christ. He enlightens and empowers the believer and the church in worship, evangelism, and service

#### III. MAN

Man is the special creation of God, made in His own image. He created them male and female as the crowning work of His creation. The gift of gender is thus part of the goodness of God's creation. In the beginning man was innocent of sin and was endowed by his Creator with freedom of choice. By his free choice man sinned against God and brought sin into the human race. Through the temptation of Satan man transgressed the command of God, and fell from his original innocence whereby his posterity inherit a nature and an environment inclined toward sin. Therefore, as soon as they are capable of moral action, they become transgressors and are under condemnation. Only the grace of God can bring man into His holy fellowship and enable man to fulfill the creative purpose of God. The sacredness of human personality is evident in that God created man in His own image, and in that Christ died for man; therefore, every person of every race possesses full dignity and is worthy of respect and Christian love.

#### IV. SALVATION

Salvation involves the redemption of the whole man, and is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Saviour, who by His own blood obtained eternal redemption for the believer. In its broadest sense salvation includes regeneration, justification, sanctification, and glorification. There is no salvation apart from personal faith in Jesus Christ as Lord.

A. Regeneration, or the new birth, is a work of God's grace whereby believers become new creatures in Christ Jesus. It is a change of heart wrought by the Holy Spirit through conviction

of sin, to which the sinner responds in repentance toward God and faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. Repentance and faith are inseparable experiences of grace.

Repentance is a genuine turning from sin toward God. Faith is the acceptance of Jesus Christ and commitment of the entire personality to Him as Lord and Saviour.

B. Justification is God's gracious and full acquittal upon principles of His righteousness of all sinners who repent and believe in Christ. Justification brings the believer unto a relationship of peace and favor with God.

C. Sanctification is the experience, beginning in regeneration, by which the believer is set apart to God's purposes, and is enabled to progress toward moral and spiritual maturity through the presence and power of the Holy Spirit dwelling in him. Growth in grace should continue throughout the regenerate person's life.

D. Glorification is the culmination of salvation and is the final blessed and abiding state of the redeemed.

#### V. GOD'S PURPOSE OF GRACE

Election is the gracious purpose of God, according to which He regenerates, justifies, sanctifies, and glorifies sinners. It is consistent with the free agency of man, and comprehends all the means in connection with the end. It is the glorious display of God's sovereign goodness, and is infinitely wise, holy, and unchangeable. It excludes boasting and promotes humility.

All true believers endure to the end. Those whom God has accepted in Christ, and sanctified by His Spirit, will never fall away from the state of grace, but shall persevere to the end. Believers may fall into sin through neglect and temptation, whereby they grieve the Spirit, impair their graces and comforts, and bring reproach on the cause of Christ and temporal judgments on themselves; yet they shall be kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation.

#### VI. THE CHURCH

A New Testament church of the Lord Jesus Christ is an autonomous local congregation of baptized believers, associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the gospel; observing the two ordinances of Christ, governed by His laws, exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by His Word, and seeking to extend the gospel to the ends of the earth. Each congregation operates under the Lordship of Christ through democratic processes. In such a congregation each member is responsible and accountable to Christ as Lord. Its scriptural officers are pastors and deacons. While both men and women are gifted for service in the church, the office of pastor is limited to men as qualified by Scripture.

The New Testament speaks also of the church as the Body of Christ which includes all of the redeemed of all the ages, believers from every tribe, and tongue, and people, and nation.

#### VII. BAPTISM AND THE LORD'S SUPPER

Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. It is an act of obedience symbolizing the believer's faith in a crucified, buried, and risen Saviour, the believer's death to sin, the burial of the old life, and the resurrection to walk in newness of life in Christ Jesus. It is a testimony to his faith in the final resurrection of the dead. Being a church ordinance, it is prerequisite to the privileges of church membership and to the Lord's Supper.

The Lord's Supper is a symbolic act of obedience whereby members of the church, through partaking of the bread and the fruit of the vine, memorialize the death of the Redeemer and anticipate His second coming.

#### VIII. THE LORD'S DAY

The first day of the week is the Lord's Day. It is a Christian institution for regular observance. It commemorates the resurrection of Christ from the dead and should include exercises of worship and spiritual devotion, both public and private. Activities on the Lord's Day should be commensurate with the Christian's conscience under the Lordship of Jesus Christ.

The Kingdom of God includes both His general sovereignty over the universe and His particular kingship over men who willfully acknowledge Him as King. Christians ought to pray and to labor that the Kingdom may come and God's will be done on earth. The full consummation of the Kingdom awaits the return of Jesus Christ and the end of this age.

God, in His own time and in His own way, will bring the world to its appropriate end. The unrighteous will be consigned to Hell, the place of everlasting punishment. The righteous in their resurrected and glorified bodies will receive their reward and will dwell forever in Heaven with the Lord.

#### XI. EVANGELISM AND MISSIONS

It is the duty and privilege of every follower of Christ and of every church of the Lord Jesus Christ to endeavor to make disciples of all nations. The new birth of man's spirit by God's Holy Spirit means the birth of love for others. Missionary effort on the part of all rests thus upon a spiritual necessity of the regenerate life, and is expressly and repeatedly commanded in the teachings of Christ. The Lord Jesus Christ has commanded the preaching of the gospel to all nations. It is the duty of every child of God to seek constantly to win the lost to Christ by verbal witness undergirded by a Christian lifestyle, and by other methods in harmony with the gospel of Christ.

#### XII. EDUCATION

Christianity is the faith of enlightenment and intelligence. In Jesus Christ abide all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge. All sound learning is, therefore, a part of our Christian heritage. The new birth opens all human faculties and creates a thirst for knowledge. Moreover, the cause of education in the Kingdom of Christ is co-ordinate with the causes of missions and general benevolence, and should receive along with these the liberal support of the churches. An adequate system of Christian education is necessary to a complete spiritual program for Christ's people.

In Christian education there should be a proper balance between academic freedom and academic responsibility. Freedom in any orderly relationship of human life is always limited and never absolute. The freedom of a teacher in a Christian school, college, or seminary is limited by the pre-eminence of Jesus Christ, by the authoritative nature of the Scriptures, and by the distinct purpose for which the school exists.

## XIII. STEWARDSHIP

God is the source of all blessings, temporal and spiritual; all that we have and are we owe to Him. Christians have a spiritual debtorship to the whole world, a holy trusteeship in the gospel, and a binding stewardship in their possessions. They are therefore under obligation to serve Him with their time, talents, and material possessions; and should recognize all these as entrusted to them to use for the glory of God and for helping others. According to the Scriptures, Christians should contribute of their means cheerfully, regularly, systematically, proportionately, and liberally for the advancement of the Redeemer's cause on earth.

#### XIV. COOPERATION

Christ's people should, as occasion requires, organize such associations and conventions as may best secure cooperation for the great objects of the Kingdom of God. Such organizations have no authority over one another or over the churches. They are voluntary and advisory bodies designed to elicit, combine, and direct the energies of our people in the most effective manner. Members of New Testament churches should cooperate with one another in carrying forward the missionary, educational, and benevolent ministries for the extension of Christ's Kingdom. Christian unity in the New Testament sense is spiritual harmony and voluntary cooperation for common ends by various groups of Christ's people. Cooperation is desirable between the various Christian denominations, when the end to be attained is itself justified, and when such cooperation involves no violation of conscience or compromise of loyalty to Christ and His Word as revealed in the New Testament.

#### XV. THE CHRISTIAN AND THE SOCIAL ORDER

All Christians are under obligation to seek to make the will of Christ supreme in our own lives and in human society. Means and methods used for the improvement of society and the establishment of righteousness among men can be truly and permanently helpful only when they are rooted in the regeneration of the individual by the saving grace of God in Jesus Christ. In the spirit of Christ, Christians should oppose racism, every form of greed, selfishness, and vice, and all forms of sexual immorality, including adultery, homosexuality, and pornography. We should work to provide for the orphaned, the needy, the abused, the aged, the helpless, and the sick. We should speak on behalf of the unborn and contend for the sanctity of all human life from conception to natural death. Every Christian should seek to bring industry, government, and society as a whole under the sway of the principles of righteousness, truth, and brotherly love. In order to promote these ends Christians should be ready to work with all men of good will in any good cause, always being careful to act in the spirit of love without compromising their loyalty to Christ and His truth.

# XVI. PEACE AND WAR

It is the duty of Christians to seek peace with all men on principles of righteousness. In accordance with the spirit and teachings of Christ they should do all in their power to put an end to war.

The true remedy for the war spirit is the gospel of our Lord. The supreme need of the world is the acceptance of His teachings in all the affairs of men and nations, and the practical application of His law of love. Christian people throughout the world should pray for the reign of the Prince of Peace.

#### XVII. RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

God alone is Lord of the conscience, and He has left it free from the doctrines and commandments of men which are contrary to His Word or not contained in it. Church and state should be separate. The state owes to every church protection and full freedom in the pursuit of its spiritual ends. In providing for such freedom no ecclesiastical group or denomination should be favored by the state more than others. Civil government being ordained of God, it is the duty of Christians to render loyal obedience thereto in all things not contrary to the revealed will of God. The church should not resort to the civil power to carry on its work. The gospel of Christ contemplates spiritual means alone for the pursuit of its ends. The state has no right to impose penalties for religious opinions of any kind. The state has no right to impose taxes for the support of any form of religion. A free church in a free state is the Christian ideal, and this implies the right of free and unhindered access to God on the part of all men, and the right to form and propagate opinions in the sphere of religion without interference by the civil power.

#### XVIII. THE FAMILY

God has ordained the family as the foundational institution of human society. It is composed of persons related to one another by marriage, blood, or adoption.

Marriage is the uniting of one man and one woman in covenant commitment for a lifetime. It is God's unique gift to reveal the union between Christ and His church and to provide for the man and the woman in marriage the framework for intimate companionship, the channel of sexual expression according to biblical standards, and the means for procreation of the human race.

The husband and wife are of equal worth before God, since both are created in God's image. The marriage relationship models the way God relates to His people. A husband is to love his wife as Christ loved the church. He has the God-given responsibility to provide for, to protect, and to lead his family. A wife is to submit herself graciously to the servant leadership of her husband even as the church willingly submits to the headship of Christ. She, being in the image of God as is her husband and thus equal to him, has the God-given responsibility to respect her husband and to serve as his helper in managing the household and nurturing the next generation.

Children, from the moment of conception, are a blessing and heritage from the Lord. Parents are to demonstrate to their children God's pattern for marriage. Parents are to teach their children spiritual and moral values and to lead them, through consistent lifestyle example and loving discipline, to make choices based on biblical truth. Children are to honor and obey their parents.

#### CHURCH-STATE RELATIONS

#### OUR HISTORIC CONCEPT OF RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

Democracy itself is rooted in the assumption that man is capable of making the choices needed for governance of his own life and his social institutions. This assumption is based in turn on the Christian concept that man is essentially a spiritual being; and only through the responses of his spiritual nature can he relate himself to God and thus rise above his animal limitations. But only one who is free can make a genuine response to God. Religious freedom is, therefore, antecedent to the creation of civil and political freedom, which constitutes the nature of democracy.

Historically, Baptists have been aggressive advocates of absolute freedom of conscience for all men. In England and Colonial America they led in formulating the concept of church-state separation. The power of government then was arbitrary and absolute, backed by an established church, the two often working in collusion to give mutual support to each other. The established church forced its doctrine and modes of worship upon all, with government lending use of its power to punish dissenters. Thus protected and supported, the established church itself was a strong political force. When joined to protect and expand their mutual vested interests, the two constituted a powerful political combine, perpetuating their power through forcing conformity in worship and stamping out dissent.

Baptists believed that this denied to man the right to live as God had willed that he live, a free and self-determining being. It destroyed an individual's liberty of the spirit, freedom of conscience, right of choice - in short, all that made a man a man, according to the Baptist conception. It was in the context of these experiences that Baptists evolved their unique conception of complete separation of the two in their respective operations.

During the evolution of the separation concept their focus of concern was always to protect the individual, Baptist or not, in the free exercise of his religious conscience, always, of course, within the context of the Christian concept of life dedicated to ministering to and serving the needs of people - whether family, neighbor or stranger. Just so on the present issue. Louisiana Baptists recognize, as Jesus indicated to Peter on the mountain top, that their place is down there in the valley where the people are - teaching, healing, serving. We are free, not to enjoy release from the demands of life, but to carry out the work of our Lord on the streets of life where men work, learn, and suffer.

#### GUIDELINES

This committee was appointed essentially "to recommend guidelines for policy implementation" concerning institutional use of governmental funds. In actuality, the Louisiana Baptist Convention has by its practice already adopted a general policy of selective participation in government programs, wherever it was felt there was no impingement on the institution's independence. It is the element of "selectivity" in this policy that makes it essential, for the guidance of all concerned - the Convention officers and the trustees and administrators of the institution. Out of its deliberations, the committee has identified certain statements of general principle which appear to offer valid guidelines for those responsible for institutional decision making.

# First: The Institution Should Identify and Clarify Its Basic Purposes.

Through continuing study and open discussion, the administrators, staff, and representatives of the governing board should develop a clear-cut understanding of the basic nature and purposes of the institution. This should be reduced to writing and circulated regularly among all related in any way with the institution.

This study should become an ongoing process of constant re-evaluation in light of our constantly changing social and technological demands. To provide leadership for this is a function of the executive officer.

# Second: Any Assistance That Creates a Limitation on or Diversion From These Purposes Should Not Be Permitted.

Once the institutional staff and its constituency are clear in their concept of the institution's nature and primary purposes, all limitations or diversions, financial or otherwise, should be avoided.

# Third: Acceptance of Government Grants.

No grant to the institution from any government agency shall be accepted. A grant shall be construed to be any transfer of funds or property for which the institution does not give adequate consideration.

# Fourth: The Institution Must Retain Its Own Integrity In the Matter of Control.

In considering whether to seek or accept funds of any type, the institution must determine whether any part of the agreement provides for governmental control of the institution's affairs - except for normal accounting procedure for the shared funds.

The institution must retain the right to determine what religious activities will be held on the premises. The Trustees of the institution and their staff must have freedom to operate in accordance with principles and policies inherent in good programs and not on the expediency of politics.

# Fifth: Participation Relationships Must be Voluntary, With Clear-Cut Terminal Arrangements.

In participating in government programs, the relationship should be voluntary on both sides, with either party able to terminate the agreement when it appears desirable. The agreement should indicate clearly the point at which the participating institution has fulfilled its obligation in the contract.

# Sixth: The Institution Must Not Become Dependent on These Funds for Program Operation.

The trustees should not permit acceptance of funds in any area of program to such an extent that the institution becomes so dependent on outside funds that it would suffer unduly if they were discontinued.

# Seventh: The Institution Must Protect the Integrity of Its Basic Programs.

The trustees must guard against any tendency on the part of the institution to become so involved with government programs that the institutional programs begin to grow around the emphasis on this public phase of its work to the neglect of its private sector.

#### Eighth: The Institution Must Not Accept Funds That Relate to Teaching of Religion.

The trustees should not accept any governmental funds that might in any way come to influence the way in which religion is taught or the word of God spread in the institution.

# Ninth: The Institution's Trustees Should Have a Large Degree of Freedom in Decision-making In These Operational Matters.

After the Convention has adopted a definite statement of policy guidelines, it should give the institutional trustees a large degree of freedom, within the guidelines, to formulate programs and make decisions affecting the ongoing program in this area as in others. With appropriate reporting through the established channels, the trustees will keep the Convention informed on their program decisions. Only so can the Convention and the trustees perform their respective roles with integrity.

The proper function of the Convention is to establish over-all policy directions. That of the trustees and their administrators is to develop and implement programs for the individual institutions within the framework of these established policy statements.

I also move that Steve McAlister, pastor of Westside, Natchitoches, preach the annual sermon for the 2020 Convention at Franklin Avenue Baptist Church in New Orleans and that Oren Conner, pastor of First Baptist Church in Baton Rouge, serve as the alternate preacher. I also move that Ricky Draper, Minister of Worship and Music, First, New Orleans, serve as the worship leader for the 2020 Convention. I also move that the location for the 2021 Annual Meeting be in north Louisiana.

- 10. Eddie Wren called for a raised ballot vote on the motion, and the motion carried.
- 11. Jay Victory presented the following standing rules:

I move that the following standing rules be adopted: That the President be allowed to make minor changes as may be necessary to the agenda; that nominating speeches for officers be limited to three (3) minutes each; that the Convention Worship Service be a fixed order of business; that debate on matters coming before the Convention be limited to two speakers for and two speakers against for a period of up to three minutes each; that persons addressing the Convention must state their name and church before they will be recognized by the Chair; and that no person addressing the Convention may speak more than twice on the same subject without unanimous consent. The Committee on Nominations and the Committee on Committees reports will be first presented and then followed by nominations from the floor, if any. Then the Committee reports shall be voted on for adoption by the Convention. If the Committee reports are adopted as presented, then the vote on persons nominated from the floor becomes moot. That a time for questions be provided following the reports of convention entities and the Executive Board. These standing rules are printed on page 31 of the Book of Reports.

- 12. Eddie Wren called for a raised ballot vote on the motion, and the motion carried.
- 13. The Voices of LC led in a time of praise and worship led by Cameron Weatherford.
- 14. Professor of Evangelism and Pastoral Leadership, New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, Jake Roudkovski, led in the Bible study using Isaiah 6:1-3 as his text stating that our greatest need as a convention is to experience a renewal of the holiness of God.
- 15. Eddie Wren called for introduction of motions.
- 16. Lloyd Whitman, messenger, First, Dry Prong, presented the following motion: I move that the Louisiana Baptist Convention form a committee, or assign to an existing committee the task of exploring ways to promote and facilitate churches to minister to offenders in local and state prisons, offender's family members, and offenders who have been released.
- 17. Checkerz Williams, messenger, Celebration, New Orleans and Church Planter at Renew Church, Baton Rouge, presented the following motion:

  I move that the Louisiana Baptist Convention adopt the same messenger requirements as the SBC. As a church planter who gives to the Cooperative Program, our church plant is able to register messengers for the SBC Annual Meeting. However, church plants are not currently allowed to register messengers for the LBC Annual Meeting.
- LBC First Vice President, Leroy Fountain, assumed the chair for this portion of the session.
- International Mission Board President, Paul Chitwood, addressed messengers and preached using Revelation 22:20-21 stating the mission of the church is urgent because His coming is imminent.
- 20. LBC Executive Director, Steve Horn, addressed messengers and expressed appreciation to Louisiana Baptists for their strong, kind, and affirming welcome as he transitioned from the pastorate to the role of Executive Director. Horn recognized new pastors to the state. Horn presented the Executive Director's report focusing on the theme "Renew" stating that we need to renew our commitment to the Lord, to one another, and to our cooperative ministries. He was joined by SBC Executive Committee Vice President of Communications, Jonathan Howe, who brought greetings from SBC Executive Committee President, Ronnie Floyd. Horn was also joined by Rev. Freddie Laing, pastor of St. Matthews Baptist Church in Pelican Point in the Bahamas. Laing and his wife reported of the devastation to their church and area from

Hurricane Dorian. Horn shared an update on the LBC President's 2020 Commission highlighting progress in reaching "every people group", compassion ministries, and operation "highways and hedges." Horn concluded his remarks by encouraging Louisiana Baptists to entreat God for favor and unity, encourage all that builds favor and unity, and eliminate all that threatens favor and unity. Horn stated there are two crucial questions to ask ourselves for the next decade: 1) Will we allow our diversity to divide us and distract us from our primary mission and 2) Will we require uniformity in order to cooperate for our primary mission? He closed with a time of prayer.

- Lacy Morris, First, Rayville, led in a time of special music, singing Holy Spirit, Breathe New Life in Me.
- 22. LBC President, Eddie Wren, presented the President's Address using Psalm 40:27-31 as his text stating that this is not a time for Louisiana Baptists to compromise, but it is a time to remember who it is that we serve. It is a time to wait on God and a time to believe.
- 23. David Goza, messenger, Jefferson, Baton Rouge, led in the benediction and the first session adjourned at 8:11 p.m.

# TUESDAY MORNING November 12, 2019

- 24. President Eddie Wren called the second session of the 172nd Annual Meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention to order at 8:30 a.m. A quorum was present.
- 25. Brad Delaughter, pastor, Satsuma, Baton Rouge, led in the opening prayer.
- 26. Cameron Weatherford led in a time of praise and worship.
- 27. Louisiana Baptist Children's Home and Family Ministries Executive Director, Perry Hancock, presented a report highlighting the ministries of the Children's Home. Hancock stated over 4,000 people had been served through the ministries of the Children's Home and 90 people saved. He thanked messengers for their continued support of the Cooperative Program. Hancock concluded his report with a testimony on foster care from Jared and Jennifer Hawthorne, The Crossing Church in Monroe.
- Eddie Wren called for questions regarding the Louisiana Baptist Children's Home report.
- 29. Committee on Order of Business Chairman, Jay Victory, presented the following report: It is the recommendation of the Committee on Order of Business that the motion made by Lloyd Whitman, messenger, First, Dry Prong, be referred to the Executive Board for study and deliberation. In response to the motion presented by Checkerz Williams, messenger, Celebration, New Orleans and Church Planter at Renew, Baton Rouge, to the best of our knowledge, our LBC Articles of Incorporation align with the SBC Constitution guidelines (Article III), regarding membership requirements for messengers. Furthermore, because our guidelines related to messenger requirements are part of our LBC Articles of Incorporation, we refer to the Executive Board for clarification.
- 30. Eddie Wren called for Introduction of Motions. There were none.
- 31. Louisiana Baptists Baptist Collegiate Ministry Team Director, Mark Robinson, presented a report and video highlighting the 100th anniversary of BCM work. He was joined by former BCM students at LSUA, Belle and Blake Chatelain, and current BCM student at LSU, Baton Rouge, Katie Bowlin, who shared testimonies of the impact of BCM ministry in their lives. Robinson concluded his report by recognizing all the BCM campus ministers.

- 32. New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary President, Jamie Dew, brought greetings to messengers stating that he takes great delight and is honored to be used by God to prepare men and women that are sent to their campus. He thanked messengers for their support through the Cooperative Program.
- Committee on Credentials Chairman, Marvin Leleux, announced 570 messengers registered.
- 34. Eddie Wren called for nominations for Louisiana Baptist Convention President.
- Kirk Jones, messenger, Fellowship, Prairieville, nominated Jeff Ginn, pastor, Istrouma, Baton Rouge, as LBC President.
- 36. Eddie Wren called for other nominations.
- Philip Robertson, messenger, Philadelphia, Deville, nominated David Cranford, pastor, First, Ponchatoula.
- 38. Tellers Committee Chairman, Mike Sullivan, messenger, First, Rayville gave instructions regarding the ballot vote for LBC President.
- 39. LBC First Vice President, Leroy Fountain, assumed the chair for this portion of the session.
- 40. Leroy Fountain made several announcements as a matter of information to messengers.
- 41. Cameron Weatherford led in a time of praise and worship.
- 42. President Eddie Wren assumed the chair.
- 43. Executive Board President, Waylon Bailey, pastor, First, Covington, presented the report from the Executive Board as printed on pages 12-13 of the *Book of Reports*. Bailey was joined by Executive Director, Steve Horn, who recognized Bill Robertson and wife. Linda. upon his retirement as LBC Pastoral Leadership Team Director.
- 44. Waylon Bailey moved the adoption of the 2020 Cooperative Program Allocation Budget of \$18,653,700 as printed on page 14 of the *Book of Reports*.
- 45. Eddie Wren called for the question and the motion was adopted.
- 46. Waylon Bailey presented a response to the motion referred to the Executive Board at the 2018 Annual Meeting regarding the formation of a committee to explore establishing a Christian-based addiction recover center. Bailey stated that a study committee has been formed. The committee has met and will continue to meet in the coming months. The committee will be ready to give a more detailed report and make a recommendation during the 2020 Annual Meeting in New Orleans.
- 47. Eddie Wren called for questions regarding the Executive Board report.
- 48. Louisiana Baptists Missions and Ministry Team Director, John Hebert, presented a video report focusing on the team's ministries: Church Planting, Children/Youth Missions Education, Disaster Relief, Compassion Ministry, Every People Group, and Mission Builders. Hebert was joined by Mission Builders Strategist Mike Shumock who reported that over 400 volunteers had assisted eight churches and missions with construction in 2018. They expressed appreciation to the messengers for their support of the Georgia Barnette State Missions Offering which makes ministry projects possible.
- 49. Eddie Wren declared a fifteen minute recess.
- 50. Committee on Nominations Chairman, Lonnie Wascom, Crossroads, Hammond, presented the Committee on Nominations Report as printed on pages 27-30 of the *Book of Reports* and moved the adoption of the report.
- 51. Eddie Wren called for additional nominations. There were none.
- 52. Eddie Wren called for the question and the motion carried.

- 53. Committee on Committees Chairman, Keith Sheridan, messenger, Lee's Creek, Bogalusa, presented the Committee on Committees Report as printed on pages 25-26 of the *Book of Reports* and moved the adoption of the report.
- 54. Eddie Wren called for additional nominations. There were none.
- 55. Eddie Wren called for the question and the motion carried.
- 56. Tellers' Chairman, Mike Sullivan, reported the results of the LBC President election. At the time of the election, there were 570 registered messengers with 391 ballots collected. David Cranford received 215 votes (54.99%) and Jeff Ginn received 172 votes (43.99%). Four ballots were disqualified because they were not completed correctly.
- 57. Eddie Wren declared David Cranford LBC President elect.
- 58. Eddie Wren called for nominations for LBC First Vice President.
- Jack Hunter, messenger, First, New Orleans, nominated Leroy Fountain, member, Franklin Avenue. New Orleans.
- 60. Eddie Wren called for other nominations. There were no other nominees.
- 61. In compliance with Article VIII, Section 2, of the LBC Constitution, LBC Secretary/ Treasurer, Steve Horn, cast a unanimous ballot for Leroy Fountain as First Vice President of the Louisiana Baptist Convention.
- 62. Eddie Wren declared Leroy Fountain as First Vice President-elect of the Louisiana Baptist Convention.
- 63. Baptist Message executive editor, Will Hall, presented the Baptist Message report. Hall stated the Baptist Message reports on events and issues impacting Louisiana Baptists and their focus is to share the gospel in every issue. Hall presented an overview of the work of the Office of Public Policy and stated we are spreading hope in the state capitol by our presence in the legislature. Senator Beth Mizell, member, First, Franklinton, recipient of the Esther's Courage Award and Senator Gerald Long, member, First, Natchitoches, recipient of the Shammah's Courage Award addressed the messengers.
- 64. Eddie Wren called for questions regarding the *Baptist Message* report.
- 65. Committee on Moral and Social Concerns Chairman, John Fream, messenger, Cypress, Benton presented the Committee on Moral and Social Concerns Report as printed on page 35 of the *Book of Reports*.
- 66. Cameron Weatherford led in special music singing, "Is He Worthy."
- 67. Jeffery Friend, pastor, Suburban, New Orleans, preached the Convention sermon using Matthew 25:34 as his text and "from the least of these" as his topic. Friend expressed appreciation to Louisiana Baptists' staff for their response and support during the time that his home and church were devastated by a tornado.
- 68. Glen Harrigill, pastor, Riverside, Vidalia, led in closing prayer and the second session adjourned at 11:22.

# TUESDAY AFTERNOON November 12, 2019

- 69. President Eddie Wren called the third session of the 172nd Annual Meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention to order at 1:45 p.m. A quorum was present.
- LBC Second Vice President, Eddie Rhymes, messenger, Mangham Baptist Church, Mangham, assumed the chair for this portion of the session.
- 71. Kevin Roberts, LifeWay Christian Resources, Nashville, Tennessee, shared a brief report and presented gifts to Eddie Wren and Leroy Fountain. Roberts concluded his presentation with video greetings from LifeWay CEO Ben Mandrell.
- 72. Cameron Weatherford led in a time of praise and worship.
- 73. Jason McNaughten, member, First, New Roads, led in the opening prayer.
- 74. Jake Roudkovski led in a second Bible study time using Revelation 2:1-6 as his text and focusing on our commitment to Christ. Roudkovski asked messengers if there was a time in life that you were closer to Jesus than you are today; was there a time that you were more passionate about Jesus than today; and was there a time in your life that you were more in love with Jesus than today. He concluded his Bible study time with a prayer of recommitment of our heart, soul, and mind.
- 75. Louisiana Baptists Communications Team Director, John Kyle, presented a video report.
- 76. Eddie Wren called for nominations for LBC Second Vice President.
- 77. Mike Holloway, messenger, Ouachita, West Monroe, nominated Marc Taylor, member, Cook, Ruston.
- 78. Eddie Wren called for other nominations. There were no other nominations.
- 79. In compliance with Article VIII, Section 2 of the LBC Constitution, LBC Secretary/ Treasurer, Steve Horn, cast a unanimous ballot for Marc Taylor as Second Vice President of the Louisiana Baptist Convention.
- 80. Eddie Wren declared Marc Taylor as Second Vice-President-elect of the Louisiana Baptist Convention.
- 81. Resolutions Committee Chairman, Steve McAlister, messenger, Westside, Natchitoches, presented the Resolutions Committee Report as printed on pages 32-34 of the *Book of Reports* and moved the adoption of the report.
- 82. Eddie Wren called for the question and the motion carried.
- 83. Louisiana Baptist Foundation Executive Director, Wayne Taylor, presented a report to the messengers. Taylor stated that the Foundation manages \$160,000,000 on behalf of Louisiana Baptists and that number is a culmination of 75 years. He reminded messengers that the Louisiana Baptist Foundation exists to help Louisiana Baptist be good stewards by gifting individuals. Taylor thanked the messengers for their continued support of the Cooperative Program and concluded his report with a video presentation.
- 84. Louisiana Baptists Evangelism/Church Growth Team Director, Keith Manuel, presented a report including a video presentation promoting the upcoming ECON at First, Lafayette and the Who's Your One Rally at Istrouma, Baton Rouge, in January. Messengers received a "Who's Your One" coin as a reminder to pray for your "one."
- 85. Cameron Weatherford led in a time of music.
- 86. Clint Pressley, senior pastor, Hickory Grove, Charlotte, North Carolina, brought the closing message using John 3:22-36 as his text.

- 87. Eddie Wren recognized outgoing LBC officers, First Vice President, Leroy Johnson, and Second Vice President, Eddie Rhymes, and presented them with a plaque.
- 88. Eddie Wren recognized newly elected LBC officers, President, David Cranford, First, Ponchatoula, First Vice President Leroy Fountain, Franklin Avenue, New Orleans, and Second Vice President Marc Taylor, member, Cook Ruston.
- 89. LBC President David Cranford addressed the messengers thanking them for the opportunity to serve and asking for prayer for him and the leaders of the Convention.
- 90. Steve Horn led in a time of prayer for the new LBC officers.
- 91. Nathan Davis, pastor, First, Coushatta, led in the benediction.
- 92. President Eddie Wren adjourned the 172nd Annual Meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention at 4:02 p.m.

## STATE MISSIONS SERVICES FOR CHURCHES AND ASSOCIATIONS

## **EXECUTIVE TEAM** Steve Horn, Executive Director

The work of the Executive Team can be broadly summarized in three words: lead, manage, and represent.

These functions are triggered by the actions of the churches represented during the Annual Meeting of the Louisiana Baptist Convention each November. Once the seated messengers hear and vote on various reports and motions, the work of the Executive Team is set in motion.

#### Lead

Upon adjournment of the Annual Meeting, the work of our convention of churches continues via the Executive Board of the Louisiana Baptist Convention and the State Missions Services staff. The Executive Board meets three times a year—May, September, and November.

The Executive Team leads the approved efforts of Louisiana Baptists to equip the churches for effective ministry and evangelize the lost in our state.

Specifically, the Executive Team coordinates the broad efforts of the State Mission Services staff. Assignments and strategies are delegated to one of seven teams. Each team has provided a report for your review.

During the course of last year, as outlined in our bylaws, the Executive Team worked with the Executive Board in the search for a new Executive Director to replace retired Executive Director, Dr. David Hankins. The search committee was led by Dr. Waylon Bailey, Pastor of First Covington. The committee held their first meeting during the 2018 Annual Meeting in Ruston with the goal of presenting a candidate for consideration during the May 2019 meeting of the Executive Board. The board also coordinated the retirement reception for the outgoing Executive Director.

#### Manage

Closely related to leading is the managing component of the Executive Team. The Executive Team manages the personnel and budgets of the State Missions Services staff. The last several years have seen reductions in personnel and budgets; however, the staff continues to operate in the black despite decreased budgets and increased benefit costs, primarily relating to medical coverage.

The Executive Director works with the elected LBC President to coordinate the planning and execution of the Annual Meeting. He also works with the elected Executive Board President to plan and coordinate the scheduled Executive Board meetings.

Publications including the Book of Reports and Annuals are generated by the Executive Team and distributed via public meetings or made available for download via our website, LouisianaBaptists.org.

The Office of Public Policy falls under the purview of the Executive Team. Dr. Will Hall, Editor of the Baptist Message, provides leadership in this area on behalf of Louisiana Baptists. His report is included below.

#### Represent

Regular communication with the leaders of all LBC entities is a priority. The Executive Director serves as an ex-officio member of the Board of Trustees for every Louisiana Baptist entity and regularly attends their board meetings.

Association Mission Strategists (formerly Directors of Missions) are key partners in our cooperative structure. The Executive Director engages in regular communications with these partners and hosts periodic meetings during the year to enhance the communication and coordination of shared ministries. Dr. Bill Robertson, Director of our Pastoral Leadership Team, assists in this effort.

The Executive Director also represents Louisiana Baptists during various meetings of SBC entities and frequently serves on SBC committees and boards.

One of the most important functions of the Executive Director is to represent the larger Louisiana Baptist family to local congregations. Invitations to speak during regular services and special events are welcomed and will be accepted as schedules permit.

# BUSINESS & INFORMATION SERVICES TEAM Dale D. Lingenfelter, Director

The Business and Information Services Team serves as a support group for all the work of the LBC State Missions Services. The team provides expertise in the areas of financial accounting, information technology, facilities maintenance, office services, and human resources. Our goal is to enhance and support the work of all LBC Teams so they accomplish the missions and ministry goals of the Convention.

In addition to coordinating the Annual Church Profile (ACP) process for the state, Shana Johnson serves as **Information Services** Support Manager and is responsible for the overall information technical support systems of the Convention and several state entities that are housed within the Baptist Building. In cooperation with other SBC state conventions and national SBC entities, Information Services has been instrumental in developing an online database of all SBC congregations and leadership. This program has become the national database for all SBC congregations and all SBC entities, both state and national. The database consists of all information collected through the ACP each year, as well as information directly communicated to the office. All information is retained so as to maintain historical statistical and leadership information for each reporting congregation. Through her team's effort along with assistance from the entire State Mission Services Staff, ACP reporting of all Louisiana Baptist congregations maintains an above average reporting percentage within the SBC network of congregations.

The LBC Accounting Team provides competent tax and accounting information to Louisiana Baptist Churches. It's more likely than not your church secretary has contacted us with questions on Budgeting, Accounting, Payroll Taxes, and Church Accounting issues. We are here to help you! Our contact information can be found on the LBC website. In addition, consistent with prior years, the Louisiana Baptist Convention received an excellent review on our Annual Audit Report.

**Tall Timbers'** new director, Josh Bumgardner, and his staff continue to serve the churches of the Louisiana Baptist Convention by providing a place for retreats, conferences, camps, seminars, and other events. This is accomplished by programs sponsored by Louisiana Baptist Convention entities, Tall Timbers, and church groups who provide their own programs. The majority of summer camps filled to capacity in the summer of 2019. Every week, students continue to make life-changing decisions for God. This year, we added 40 more cabin spaces to our lodging, and plan to add another 40 spaces by the summer of 2020 to accommodate our growth in summer camp attendance. Hotel room renovations are underway with one floor of rooms to be completed this summer and the other 2 floors to follow soon. We are continuing to meet the needs of our camp and retreat season guests and see more growth and great things ahead!

The Business and Information Services Team considers all of its various areas of support work as ministry unto the Lord. We count it a privilege to serve our Lord by serving our colleagues and Louisiana Baptists in the work of reaching Louisiana for Christ and strengthening our churches.

## BAPTIST COLLEGIATE MINISTRY

100 years old! Baptist Collegiate Ministry turns 100 in the fall of 2019. The first collegiate ministry was established at LSU in 1919 and it remains one of the strongest ministries in the country with over 80 students in leadership annually and taking over 300 students on mission with 200 of those serving churches in Mexico. You can find that kind of impact on every campus in the state. This last summer the Northwestern BCM ministered to over 80 student athletes and campus workers weekly. Several campuses hosted freshmen orientation all summer and over 270 attended national collegiate week at Falls Creek, Oklahoma. The GOLA college student VBS teams had another incredible summer of church impact. The GOLA student Disaster Relief team served flooded churches and homes all over the south.

Louisiana Baptists can be proud of their 100 year old Baptist Collegiate ministry this year. It changes lives in people at the most influential age of growth.

## **COMMUNICATIONS TEAM**

## INTERNAL AND EXTERNAL

These two audiences are the focus of the Communications Team.

The internal audience is comprised of the teams of the Executive Board and Louisiana Baptist churches. Most of this work supports the missions and ministries of the State Missions Services Staff.

Externally, we believe we are called to communicate the Gospel to the vast majority of Louisiana's population who are far from God and do not attend any church. These "nones," if you will, comprise the external audience. *Here for You* has been a strategic tool to reach this audience.

Last year was another year of transition as several key Communication Team members moved to other ministry opportunities and other positions were eliminated due to budget considerations. Even with those transitions, the Lord blessed our efforts as follows:

More than 326 promotional pieces were designed and distributed, up from 145 four years ago.
 Web and social media graphics are not included in that total.

- Sixty-nine videos were created and produced. These generated over 32,000 online views.
   When you factor in social media, the total jumps to over half-a-million views (581,062).
- LouisianaBaptists.org welcomed more than 204,000 visitors last year. This is up from 61,000 in 2014. More and more of our website visitors are coming via mobile devices.
- Louisiana Baptists social media footprint increased to more than 3,300 Facebook followers and 4,000 Twitter followers. Our newly created Instagram grew to 374 followers.
- Here for You, Louisiana Baptists multi-media evangelism strategy, wrapped up a three year
  pilot in SE Louisiana and prepared for a statewide launch in February 2019. During its three
  year run more than 233,000 people were engaged via broadcast and cable outlets. This number
  does not include the impact of the Super Bowl, Final Four, or social media.

Louisiana Baptists entered a partnership with the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association and their Internet Evangelism effort. Since its inception, this effort has seen more than 13 million indicated decisions for Christ around the world. In Louisiana, more than 10,000 people indicated a decision for Christ in 2018 and roughly a third of those provided enough information for some sort of follow up. This figure represents their statewide response and is not tied directly to our partnership. The Graham organization has designed a custom landing page for Louisiana Baptists and early results are encouraging. In June 2019, more than 600 people viewed the Gospel presentation on *HereforYou.org* and 124 of those people indicated a decision for Christ. Discussions are underway that will enable Louisiana Baptist congregations to follow up on decisions in their area that have come via this partnership. There is a need for email coaches, discipleship coaches, and chat coaches. Pastors/churches are encouraged to participate. Training is provided through the Graham organization at https://searchforjesus.net/get-involved/

# EVANGELISM AND CHURCH GROWTH TEAM Keith Manuel, Director

Reaching the Next Generation was the emphasis of the Evangelism Conference hosted by First, Covington. One of the unique features of the conference, called ECON, was a pair of father and son preachers, the Hankins and Luters, praying over one another and recounting stories of their faith passed down generationally. Next year's ECON will be January 27-28, 2020. Our host is First, Lafayette.

Sean Keith is our Sunday School, Discipleship, and Revitalization Strategist. The ReGroup Conference and Associational Clinics reached almost 1,000 participants, and helped equip pastors, staff, and lay leaders to reach their communities with the Gospel through small groups. Our new event, The Sunday School Challenge, reached another 150 churches and almost 500 people to help develop and grow this vital ministry.

Our Adult Ministries and Church Administration Strategist is Jeff Ingram. He coordinated the Senior Adult portion of ECON 2018 with over 450 participants this year. In addition, Jeff hosted over 200 pastors/leaders for the annual January Bible Study and Doctrine Study previews and the Prayer Boot Camp with

Claude King. This Strategist coordinates the work of the GOLA/VBS teams on the church side of the ministry. The assignment includes enlisting, training, and follow-up with the local churches using these college students for VBS. The work in Church Administration is mainly in consultations with churches/associations that cover the following areas: Pastor/Staff Salary Breakdowns; IRS Compliance; Best Practices for Church Finance Committees; Church/Associational By-Laws; Code of Ethics for Ministerial Staff; Church Staff Job Descriptions; and Sexual Harassment & Abuse.

Brandon Lewis is the newest member of the team, joining our staff as the Youth Strategist. This year marked the return of the Youth Evangelism Celebration to the Rapides Parish Coliseum, with 6,000 in attendance and many different spiritual decisions made during this powerful, two-day gathering. Youth camps conducted in the summer at Tall Timbers had 1,400 participants with many decisions for the Lord and others called to full-time ministry. The Louisiana All-State Youth Choir, led by consultant Herb Armentrout, toured and ministered to hundreds in Texas and Louisiana. The students do much more than learn music. They learn a Gospel presentation and minister in shelters, prisons, and on the streets.

Serving as your Children's Ministry Strategist is David Anderson. This year all three weeks of Children's Camp at Tall Timbers were completely full, and our fourth week of camp for special needs people, continues to grow. Again, this year, there was strong attendance for the VBS training for LifeWay's VBS Curriculum. Pre-Teen Invasion, held at Louisiana College, continues to reach a large number of 4th-6th graders with nearly 1,000 preteens participating. In addition, there was a revised work with children's choirs called Kid's Weekend of Worship. There were several different tracks for kids to engage in worship, even outside of a traditional choir.

# MISSIONS AND MINISTRY TEAM John D. Hebert, Director

The Missions and Ministries Team of the Convention is committed to helping our churches reach their full potential in reaching our state for Christ. The Team is led by Rev. John Hebert, who will celebrate his 20th year at LBC just prior to our annual meeting in November. Highlights for the year include a highly successful church planting effort, strides in our compassion ministry engagement with churches, and a growing mission builder program. These highlights accompany the execution of new strategies in Women's Missions and Ministry, Partnership Missions, Disaster Relief/Men's Ministry, and Mission Education.

Dr. James Jenkins, Director of Church Planting, continues to lead the effort of Church Planting. His team is comprised of Rev. Lane Corley, our Anglo-Church Planting and Replant Strategist, and Rev. Carlos Schmidt, Language Church Planting and Partnership Missions Strategist. Together with our churches and associations, these men have worked to meet the goal of the 2020 Presidential Commission to plant 300 new churches by the year 2020. By mid-year 2019, that number is now 242 or 81% of the goal. The spiritual fruit of these church plants is 3,536 baptisms and 13,208 decisions for Christ since 2010.

Carlos Schmidt has fully embraced Louisiana Baptists Partnership Missions. He has reaffirmed the partnerships with Haiti, Belarus, and Brazil and is in the process of establishing new partnerships with the US Virgin Islands, Puerto Rico, Brownsville/Matamoros, Upstate New York and New York City, Cape Bretton Island Canada, Yucatan Mexico, Madrid, Indonesia, Korea, and Romania. Carlos organized a MISSIONS READY conference with the participation of IMB, NAMB, BGR, and other missions practitioners serving in Louisiana. Carlos will be scheduling regional Missions Ready Round Tables to mobilize Louisiana Baptist to be obedient to the great Commission.

In the ever-changing landscape of Women's Missions and Ministry, new relationships are very important. Jess Archer is connecting with leaders of teen girls to develop discipleship and missions avenues that produce missional living. Women's Missions and Ministry advocates are assisting Janie Wise to establish key women's contacts in all our churches and to assess leader development needs. The benefits of new relationships have resulted in a 70% increase in registration at the 2019 women's conference, R.E.A.L., and a sold-out Children's Missions Camp in July, 2019. Our goal is to see these increases impact discipleship, mission's education, and mission giving.

The Compassion Ministries work led by Dr. Jeffrey Cook has progressed in the past year in engaging every Louisiana Baptist Church in Compassion Ministries. There are currently 800 Louisiana Baptist churches involved in some kind of Compassion Ministry. The work of promoting and encouraging churches to be involved is organized by Dr. Cook and a team of Association Compassion Missionaries in 7 associations. These workers are John Anderson, Scott Teutsch, Don Meadows, Kent Newell, Deanna Corbett, and Pam Walker. The team has also helped promote chaplaincy by providing training for pastors who desire to be credentialed in chaplaincy.

Compassion Ministry seeks to meet human needs, build trust, fully share the Gospel, and connect people to the local church. Currently, approximately 70% of our churches are actively involved in Compassion Ministry on a regular basis. Churches are feeding people, opening thrift stores, teaching ESL, working in prisons, providing after school programs, working with people addicted to drugs and alcohol, providing chaplaincy training, etc. Additionally, we have several ACMs (Associational Compassion Missionaries) serving in various metro areas in Louisiana. Compassion Ministry continues to seek creative ways to engage the local church in local mission work. The goal is to see EVERY church in Louisiana actively involved in Compassion Ministry on a regular basis.

The Mission Builders program is blessed to have completed much work and to have brothers and sisters in Christ who have come along side of us to accomplish great things for the Lord. We have been at work at the office of the Baptist Association of Greater Baton Rouge, Moreauville Community Baptist Church, Leesville Korean, and First, Port Barre. We are anticipating work beginning at First, Napoleonville and Gray's Creek, Denham Springs, as well as others. Perhaps your church, Association, or you individually might consider joining us to get these opportunities ready for the purpose God desires.

Dr. Gibbie McMillan of Men's Ministries and Disaster Relief has been busy this year in the area of disasters, experiencing a tornado in Ruston which required the calling out 1,200 volunteers to help clean the debris. Only two weeks later 5 tornados came across southwest Louisiana focusing on the city of Ville Platte. Thanks to the chainsaw teams across south Louisiana the major part of the damage was handled in a week completing 35 chainsaw jobs. Nebraska, Kansas, Iowa, Missouri, Arkansas, Oklahoma, and Texas have all been affected with tornados and flooding to which we also have sent teams to help. The time to prepare is before the disaster strikes and we held 6 trainings across the state from New Orleans to Shreveport and from Lake Charles to Zachary. Our shower units are always in demand by groups as well as churches hosting large groups doing rebuild in various places. Louisiana Baptists are still leading the charge when disasters happen.

In other areas of Men's Ministries, Dr. McMillan works with Royal Ambassadors through coordinating events like RA Congress and Missions Camp held at Tall Timbers Conference Center. Laymen like Hartie Spence, from FBC Lafayette, lead in a similar effort by planning and coordinating Survivor Man Camp at ABC in Eunice. Mike Collie, layman from Temple in Ruston, coordinates Camp O Ree held at Camp Harris in Minden. Missions Education is a vital part in preparing our young men for the future of missions in Louisiana.

Jess Archer, the Children/Youth Missions Strategist, worked with our Men's Ministries RA Staff Leader Mike Collie to conduct a combined camp in the summer of 2019 at Tall Timbers. With over 425 in attendance, many decisions were made for Christ during the week by both boys and girls. Jess Archer also spoke with eight new churches who were interested in starting Preschool, Children, and Youth WMU programs.

## PASTORAL LEADERSHIP TEAM

## Bill Robertson, Director

The Pastoral Leadership Team serves churches of all sizes in many different ministries. This past year, we had 75 requests for resumes through our resume service. We have about 650 resumes on our server.

Granberry Counseling is a very important ministry to our pastors, staff, and ministers. This ministry is provided through your gifts to the Cooperative program at no cost to our ministry staff. Thank you so much for your faithful giving.

We were able to train 44 men as transitional pastors to serve churches without a pastor. These men provide leadership and guidance to prepare the church for their next pastor. A current list of trained transitional pastors is maintained in our office for your consideration.

Pastor search committee training remains an important task as we seek to serve our churches. We have a pastor search tool box which can be found online to better equip a committee to find God's man for their church.

We partnered with our Directors of Missions in providing financial assistance through the Shepherd's fund. We dispersed \$14,900 in assistance in 2018.

We are here to serve you and minister to you in any way we can.

# LOUISIANA BAPTIST MESSAGE Will Hall, Editor

For more than 135 years, the *Baptist Message* has been a partner in the Gospel with Louisiana Baptists, jointly promoting the Kingdom of God in our state and beyond. During 2019 that meant we covered stories ranging in scope from world events to local church happenings.

Media outlets around the globe celebrated the human achievement aspect of landing men on the moon 50 years ago. But the *Baptist Message* was one of the few news services to highlight a key spiritual moment, recounting astronaut Buzz Aldrin's worship of God by his celebrating the Lord's Supper on the lunar surface.

The *Baptist Message* provided a faith perspective about a national maelstrom that erupted because of a Christian-themed message included in a Mac's Fresh Market advertising mailer.

Owner Reggy McDaniel, a member of Kelly Baptist Church, used a play on words about "border" and "gates" to cause readers to think about eternity. Critics complained he was mixing religion, politics, and business. But McDaniel said, and we reported, that all he was "trying to do was point people to Jesus ... and I'm still doing that."

We also covered important state legislation that made national headlines.

Beth Mizell, a member of the First Baptist Church, Franklinton, led two crucial efforts in the Capitol.

She co-sponsored the "Love Life Amendment" which will modify the state constitution, if approved by voters in 2020, to prevent a rogue state judge, as has happened in 13 states, from declaring an "implied" constitutional right to abortion that would undo all the pro-life legislation that now protects unborn children and their mothers. She also made an impassioned plea from the Senate floor that was critical to defeating an Equal Rights Amendment resolution that could have been used to embed a constitutional right to abortion in our state.

Another national topic was the "heartbeat bill" passed by the state legislature which protects an unborn child from abortion as early as his or her first heartbeat. A number of senators and representatives took strong stands to pass this legislation. But Alan Seabaugh, a member of Broadmoor Baptist Church in Shreveport, was especially effective in brushing aside critics' attempts to make exceptions for rape and incest, arguing, "We don't punish children in this country for the sins of their fathers."

The *Baptist Message* also reported national stories within the Southern Baptist Convention, following the search processes and selection of chief executives for Lifeway, the Executive Committee, Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, and our own New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary. We provided background and insights to help Louisiana Baptists understand the spiritual aspects and denominational considerations that might have contributed to the choices.

In that regard, we provided timely information on the search for and selection of a new executive director for the Louisiana Baptist Convention, resulting from the announced retirement of Dr. David Hankins who provided leadership to Louisiana Baptists and Southern Baptists in that role for nearly 15 years. We posted updates from the search committee and announced the unanimous choice by the Executive Board of Dr. Steve Horn, the immediate past pastor of the First Baptist Church in Lafayette who has served in multiple leadership roles among Louisiana Baptists and Southern Baptists.

We covered a number of important developments about Louisiana College and the ongoing progress of the school manifested by enrollment growth and facility improvements. But we also broke the story of President Rick Brewer's bold stand to part ways with the Council of Christian Colleges and Universities after that organization's board chose to endorse so-called "Fairness for All" legislation which would add special protections for sexual orientation and gender identity at the expense of religious liberty rights.

Additionally, we covered the blessing of new facilities for Franklin Avenue Baptist Church in New Orleans East; the plan to rebuild the fire-ravaged campus of the First Baptist Church in Bossier City; the federal court victory which protected housing allowances for pastors; the encroachment of Marxist thought among Christians in the form of Critical Race Theory and the teaching of Intersectionality; the Beth Moore Twitter wars; the opening of Louisiana Baptists' orphanage in Haiti; the celebration of 1,835 new believers in Brazil, largely because of Louisiana Baptists' evangelistic efforts; and, Louisiana Baptists' ongoing efforts to share the Gospel in Belarus (and the 4 in 10 return on investment, in terms of salvation decisions, from the distribution of Good and Evil Illustrated Bibles there).

In the next year, a large project we plan to undertake is to analyze and report Louisiana Baptists' accomplishments toward the 10 primary objectives of "The President's 2020 Commission Final Report."

Likewise, we will continue to explore how to use elements like our "Cultural News" section, introduced last year, as well as new features, such as the leadership series for pastors and church planters we just began, to help us inform Louisiana Baptists with the news they need to fully participate in our community of faith.

Importantly, the Gospel will remain our top priority, and we will continue to make a special effort to report about Louisiana Baptists sharing the Good News with our state, nation, and world.

### LOUISIANA BAPTIST CHILDREN'S HOME AND FAMILY MINISTRIES

Dr. Perry Hancock, President & CEO

In its 119th year of ministry, Louisiana Baptist Children's Home and Family Ministries continued its mission of providing love, care, and hope in Christ for children and families in need. The Children's Home provided a positive Christian witness through its residential child and family care programs, foster care and adoption ministries, Granberry Counseling Centers, Christian Women's Job Corp, Compassion for Kids, and Orphans Embrace.

In 2018, the Children's Home provided ministry services for over 4,000 children, families, and individuals. Through its on-campus and off-campus residential and foster care programs, LBCHFM served 327 children and 33 mothers. Sixty-three families were served through placement referrals. In addition, through its Connect 1:27 foster care ministry, the Children's Home provided training for 128 foster family members.

The Granberry Counseling Centers staff provided professional Christian counseling for 1,044 individuals during the year. Through its Minister Care program, a partnership with the Pastoral Leadership division of the Louisiana Baptist Convention, Granberry provided counseling for 64 Louisiana Baptist minister families.

Christian Women's Job Corp provided educational and job skills training for 65 women in 2018. The ministry had one of the highest graduation rates in the northeast region. In addition, CWJC became a WorldCrafts partner with Women's Missionary Union. WorldCrafts is a micro enterprise program for impoverished women. The Children's Home was recognized at the Southern Baptist Convention in Birmingham for its excellent work with WorldCrafts.

Through a growing community care ministry, Compassion for Kids, the Children's Home served over 1,600 economically-challenged children and family members in the greater Monroe/West Monroe area. Compassion for Kids provides life essentials and the message of Christ, meeting both physical and spiritual needs.

In 2018, the Children's Home shared God's love in word and deed through its international orphan care ministry, Orphans Embrace. Fifty-four Louisiana Baptists ministered to over 716 children and others in Haiti. Construction continued on a children's village and school in Haiti which is sponsored by the Children's Home, several Louisiana Baptist churches, and the Louisiana Baptist Convention.

Louisiana churches once again provided support for the Children's Home through the Annual Children's Home Sunday Offering. The offering meets many of the critical needs the children have during the year. Churches also continued to support children and families at the Home through the Fall Food Roundup which provides all of the non-perishable foods needed for the entire year. In the summer, churches from across Louisiana donated their VBS offerings to support the children. Many churches provided additional assistance in various ways throughout the year and God used LBC Cooperative Program giving from the churches to share His love with those in need.

As a result of the support from our churches and the witness provided by the various ministries of the Home, over 90 people experienced the joy of salvation in Christ and received real hope for life and life eternal. Thank you Louisiana Baptists for meeting needs and changing lives through your Louisiana Baptist Children's Home and Family Ministries.

### LOUISIANA BAPTIST FOUNDATION

### Wayne Taylor, Executive Director

The Foundation is celebrating its 75th anniversary in 2019. Since 1944 the LBF has helped Louisiana Baptists create giving plans that have benefited local Baptist churches, Louisiana College, the Louisiana Baptist Children's Home, and other organizations associated with the Louisiana Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention. Nearly \$135 million dollars has been distributed to God's Kingdom work through the Foundation since its beginning.

The Foundation was chartered as a non-profit agency of the Louisiana Baptist Convention in 1944 for the purpose of encouraging and assisting with gifts to the churches, institutions, and entities of the LBC, and the Southern Baptist Convention. A total of 14 Trustees govern the LBF with 12 elected by the Convention and the Executive Director of the LBC and the Convention President serving ex-officio. The LBF receives approximately 26% of its operational funding from the Cooperative Program with the remainder provided through fee-based income on assets under management.

The Foundation also provides investment management and trust administration services for churches, institutions, and ministries of Louisiana Baptists, as well as for individuals who wish to sustain Baptist ministries into the future. Baptist churches and institutions benefit from using the Short Term Fund, but can also receive the gifts through a variety of methods including Gift Annuities, Bequests, Donor Advised Funds, Charitable Remainder Trusts, and Pass Through gifts.

### Highlights from 2018 include:

- Distributions or reinvestments of \$6,474,318 were made in 2018. The total market value of assets managed at December 31, 2018 was \$149,926,843.
- Over 400 Louisiana Baptist churches, agencies and institutions had over \$46 million on deposit in the Foundation's Short Term Fund (STF) at December 31, 2018. The STF provides a savings account option with instant liquidity and still offers a competitive interest rate. Other added benefits of using the STF include the ACH electronic transfer system and the monthly e-mail statement service. There were over 300 participants in the ACH system in 2018.
- Gifts, bequests, and trusts received by the Louisiana Baptist Foundation for the support of Christian ministry totaled \$904,965 in 2018. Every gift is significant because it supports ministries that spread the Good News of salvation through Jesus. Some examples are highlighted below:
  - Donor Advised Funds (DAF) have provided a strong avenue of giving in the past several years. In 2018, contributions to new or existing DAF's exceeded \$152,000. These funds also made distributions to Baptist ministries throughout the year including the LBCH, Louisiana College, numerous local churches, several scholarships, as well as various other ministries.
  - The Foundation assisted with stock donations totally nearly \$766,000. The Foundation receives the stock from the donor, sells the stock, and passes the proceeds to the ministry selected by the donor.
     Beneficiaries include Louisiana College, LBCH, a number of churches, and a Baptist camp.
- The Foundation is currently working to complete successions of three different estates that will benefit
  numerous Baptist ministries. The total, when completed will be approximately \$1.2 million. The LBF
  staff can assist you with an estate plan that supports Baptist ministry beyond your lifetime.
- Cooperative Program dollars invested in the Louisiana Baptist Foundation yield great returns for the
  Convention and its entities. In 2018, the LBF received \$220,436 from the Cooperative Program and
  the LBF distributed \$6,031,518 to Baptist causes in return. Over the 75 year history of the Foundation,
  the Cooperative Program has invested \$10,097,616 while over \$134.9 million has been distributed or
  reinvested for Baptist causes!

### LOUISIANA COLLEGE

### Dr. Rick Brewer, President

Louisiana College has much to be thankful for and is grateful first to God and then to members of LBC churches who generously support our Vision of Preparing Graduates and Transforming Lives through the Cooperative Program. Without such financial and prayerful support, the following strides noted below would have been far less achievable. I know you will rejoice with us as you read how God has blessed your generosity and the College's stewardship of Kingdom resources.

### ADVANCEMENT

Since Oct. 2018, LC has received \$5.5 million in restricted and unrestricted gifts. Our Board of Visitors includes 176 members, whose \$250,000 in annual support goes wholly and solely to qualified students' scholarships. We have enlisted 12 participants in our 20/20 Plan that seeks 20 persons or entities that will give \$10K a year for two years (2019 and 2020).

### **ENROLLMENT & RETENTION**

Enrollment has increased by 11% since Fall 2015. From Fall 2018 to Spring 2019, LC grew at a rate of 7.2%, which is 2.5 times greater than peer schools, and our retention rate was 94%. This is an "Ivy League" retention rate.

### ACADEMICS

We are gratified to partner with New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary through a Memorandum of Understanding for 3+2 programs and collaborative curricular development. We are exceptionally pleased with a cumulative 2.9 GPA among all our student-athletes, many of whom won national accolades for GPAs of 3.5 or better.

### REFURBISHMENT

We have launched a multi-phase \$5M refurbishment project that will provide significant upgrades to three residence halls, thus significantly improving our ability to recruit and retain students. The multimillion dollar Guinn Auditorium renovation is complete with a redesigned ceiling, new side wall design and up lighting, new seating, new and modern finishes, front stage modifications, a new catwalk system and lighting upgrades, sound equipment upgrades, and major HVAC/control system overhaul.

### FAITH INTEGRATION

The 4th edition of "Faith Matters" contains a collection of essays by faculty on the value of Faith Integration with a Liberal Arts Education. The annual Values & Ethics Series featured Dr. Paul Nelson, Senior Fellow, Discovery Institute; Dr. C. Ben Mitchell, Special Assistant to the President, Union University; and Dr. Wade Warren, LC Professor of Biology. Our annual God in the Workplace Conference featured Dr. Richard Blackaby; Dr. Emma Bush, Strategist/Consultant for Planning/Development, formerly of Prison Fellowship Ministries (Chuck Colson); and Mr. Blake Chatelain, President/CEO, Red River Bank. We hosted An Evening with Lewis and Tolkien: "Of Wardrobes and Rings." Evangelism emphases featured Dr. Jerry Pipes and Rev. Sean Keith. The Jenkins Center for Evangelism and Missions sponsored: Fall and Spring Revival on Campus; Missions Conference; BCM Mission Projects; Go Tell Crusade; E4 Preaching Conference; and LBC Disaster Relief Training.

This report merely scratches the surface of the many ways God is blessing Louisiana College. While we express our deep gratitude to all our constituents, we know that God will continue to bless you for your efforts to undergird His work at your Louisiana College.

# COMMITTEE ON MORAL AND SOCIAL CONCERNS John Fream, Chairman

The Committee on Moral and Social Concerns serves to "lead Louisiana Baptists to maximize their collective influence in the arena of moral and cultural concerns, especially in strengthening families," in accordance with KAIROS 10 (Key Actions for Reaching Our State) of the Report of the President's 2020 Commission.

Our committee largely works through the Office of Public Policy to accomplish this objective with regard to the policy making processes of the state legislature. But we also pursue issues and initiatives that might engage Louisiana Baptists in related compassion ministries.

This spring, the committee met in the Capitol as guests of Sen. Gerald Long. He is president pro tempore of the Senate and a faithful Louisiana Baptist. He shared insights about the legislative process and he heard our plans regarding legislative action for the coming year.

In particular, we shared about two initiatives – strengthening marriages and preventing fragmented families, and, protecting children from exposure to online pornography – we hoped to translate into public policy.

We are happy to report that Sen. Long championed SCR 56 under the auspices of the Office of the Attorney General of Louisiana. This group is charged with making recommendations to the legislature about preventing childhood exposure to pornography. The task force already has held its first meeting and Dr. Will Hall of the Louisiana Baptist Office of Public Policy has been named chair.

This task force will have the opportunity to influence internet service providers and manufacturers of internet accessible devices to take reasonable measures to prevent children from accidental or intentional access to adult content.

Regarding marriage, Sen. Beth Mizell, a faithful member of the First Baptist Church in Franklinton, carried the banner on our proposal to create incentives to protect and strengthen marriage.

She led the passage of SCR 107 which also established a task force and this team has met already as well. Her task force is considering such measures as creating tax incentives to encourage couples to participate in premarital counseling. They also are looking at structuring incentives to induce couples to undergo counseling if they have children and are considering divorce.

Louisiana has the fourth highest rate of divorce in the nation, and the work done by this task force has the potential to dramatically decrease the number of divorces in our state -- creating financial savings from the enormous social program costs, but more importantly, saving thousands of children from the harms of family fragmentation.

Our Ad Hoc Panel on Human Trafficking, led by the incredible efforts of Jeff Hoffman, pastor of the First Baptist Church in Arcadia, have received state and federal approval for the Rose Long Foundation as a 501(c)(3); and, is now pursuing its mission of restoring the lives of children rescued from human trafficking. The foundation has received its first charitable donation and already is well into the process to secure a grant which will be used to house rescued children at our Children's Home and Family services facility in Monroe.

Finally, the Moral and Social Concerns Committee has made a commitment to work through the Office of Public Policy to rally Louisiana Baptists to pass the Love Life Amendment which will be considered by voters on the 2020 state ballot. We will be reaching out to our churches through the directors of missions and pastors to enlist Louisiana Baptists to go to the polls and pass this state amendment which will prevent a rogue state judge from reading into the Louisiana Constitution a right to abortion that does not exist -- something that has happened in 13 states in recent years, invalidating all the common sense pro-life laws that had been passed by those legislatures.

# COMMITTEE ON CONVENTION ORDER OF BUSINESS Jay Victory, Chairman

The Committee on Convention Order of Business met on February 28, 2019 at the LBC Baptist Building in Alexandria. This committee makes the following recommendations:

- That the 2020 sermon be preached by Steve McAlister, pastor, Westside Baptist Church, Natchitoches.
- 2. That Oren Conner, pastor, First Baptist Church, Baton Rouge, serve as the Alternate Preacher for the 2020 Convention.
- 3. That Ricky Draper, Minister of Worship and Music, First, New Orleans, serve as Worship Leader for the 2020 Convention.
- 4. That the venue for the 2020 Convention be Franklin Avenue Baptist Church, New Orleans, Louisiana.
- 5. That the location for the 2021 Convention be in north Louisiana.
- 6. That the agenda for this 172nd annual meeting of Louisiana Baptist Convention be adopted as printed in the program and that the following proposed Convention Standing Rules be adopted:

### **Convention Standing Rules**

- 1. The President shall be allowed to make minor changes in the agenda as may be necessary.
- 2. Nominating speeches for officers shall be limited to three (3) minutes each.
- 3. The Convention Worship Service shall be a fixed order of business.
- Debate on matters coming before the convention shall be limited to two speakers for and two speakers against for a period of up to three minutes each.
- 5. Persons addressing the Convention shall state their name and church.
- 6. No person addressing the Convention may speak more than twice on the same subject without unanimous consent
- 7. The reports of the Committee on Nominations and the Committee on Committees be presented, followed by nominations from the floor, if any. Then the Committee nominees shall be voted on for election by the Convention. If the Committee nominees are not elected, then the vote on persons nominated from the floor shall follow immediately.
- 8. That a time for questions be provided following the reports of convention entities and the Executive Board.

### RESOLUTION 1: ON EXPRESSION OF APPRECIATION

WHEREAS, many individuals and groups have had a part in planning, preparing and conducting the 172nd annual meeting of our Louisiana Baptist Convention; and

**WHEREAS**, the messengers of this Convention desire to warmly recognize and express appreciation to the following:

**Mark Jones**, facility director, Randolph Riverfront Center, and his staff for their assistance with details and for providing the use of their facilities for this annual meeting; and

**Dr. Eddie Wren,** Convention president, and pastor, First Baptist Church, Rayville, for his warm, gracious spirit in leading, speaking and listening to Louisiana Baptists this year, and his gentle firmness in moderating this annual meeting; and

First Baptist Church, Rayville, for its commitment to sharing the Gospel in our state by graciously supporting Dr. Wren's leadership of all the churches of the Louisiana Baptist Convention this past year; and

Cameron Weatherford, assistant professor of music, Louisiana College, for planning and coordinating the music, and, the musicians and singers for their contribution of instrumental and vocal talents; and

**Jay Victory**, executive pastor, Northshore Church, Slidell, and, the members of the Order of Business Committee for planning this informative and inspirational annual meeting; now therefore be it

**RESOLVED,** that we, the messengers to the 172nd Session of the Louisiana Baptist Convention, meeting in Alexandria, Louisiana, November 11-12, 2019, express to each of the above, and to all who contributed, our deepest heartfelt gratitude.

### RESOLUTION 2: ON BEING A NEW CREATION

**WHEREAS**, the Bible declares that the practice of "those things which are not fitting," whether envy, murder, strife, disobedience to parents, sexual immorality, etc., "are deserving of death" and even approval of such things, likewise, is deserving of death (Romans 1:28-32); and

WHEREAS, the Bible declares that even having lust and hate in the heart are the same as having committed adultery and murder (Matthew 5:21-30); and

**WHEREAS**, the Bible declares that Believers are transformed from their previous sinful conditions whatever that state might have been, saying "such were some of you. But you were washed, but you were sanctified, but you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus and by the Spirit of our God" (2 Corinthians 5:7-11); and

WHEREAS, the Bible reinforces this doctrine of being fundamentally changed, not just making a mental assent to a new way, by declaring that "if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; old things have passed away; behold, all things have become new;" now therefore be it

**RESOLVED,** that we, the messengers to this 172nd session of the Louisiana Baptist Convention, meeting in Alexandria, Louisiana, November 11-12, 2019, declare that we who are in Christ reject who we were without Him; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that we acknowledge that Christians are tempted (James 1:14-15) and that the Bible prescribes submitting to God and resisting as means to overcome temptation (James 4:7); and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that we acknowledge that Christians sin (1 John 1:8, 10), but also that God "is faithful and just to forgive us our sins" if we confess them to Him (1 John 1:9); and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that we make a distinction between "committing a sin" and "continuing in sin" (1John 3:6); and be it finally

**RESOLVED**, that we declare this distinction to be that we have been made new, that our old selves have passed away, meaning our minds and hearts have been changed, as well as our behavior.

### **RESOLUTION 3: ON LOVE LIFE AMENDMENT**

WHEREAS, Louisiana Baptists have declared our unwavering commitment to rescue and protect life from the womb through eternity; and

WHEREAS, that commitment includes our pledge to continue to fight for the rights of the unborn and the care of their mothers; and

WHEREAS, state judges in 13 states, most recently this year in Kansas, have ignored legal precedent, or the actual language, or both, regarding their state constitutions to declare an unwritten but inherent right to an abortion, thus overturning common-sense protections for the unborn and their mothers in their laws; and

WHEREAS, in a move to prevent such action in Louisiana, the overwhelming majority of our state legislators in 2019 approved a constitutional amendment stating, "To protect human life, nothing in this Constitution shall be construed to secure or protect a right to abortion or require the funding of abortion"; and

WHEREAS, this proposed state constitutional amendment will be a ballot measure in the 2020 fall elections; now therefore be it

**RESOLVED**, that we, the messengers to this 172nd session of the Louisiana Baptist Convention, meeting in Alexandria, Louisiana, November 11-12, 2019, unequivocally reaffirm we are pro-life; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that we most strongly urge our lawmakers to continue to write legislation and pass laws that protect human life, especially the lives of the unborn and their mothers; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that we give our strongest possible endorsement of the Love Life Amendment and the constitutional protection it affords against unilateral actions to undo pro-life laws: and be it finally

**RESOLVED**, that we urge all eligible Louisiana Baptists to register and to vote for the Love Life Amendment and to encourage others to do likewise in order to overwhelmingly pass this 2020 ballot measure.

### RESOLUTION 4: RESOLUTION: ON PROTECTING THE BRIDE OF CHRIST

**WHEREAS**, the Bible describes the New Testament Church as the Bride of Christ (Ephesians 5:22-25; 2 Corinthians 11:2; Revelation 19:7-8; 21:2,9; 22:17); and

WHEREAS, Christ as the Groom suffered excruciating torture and a cruel death for His Bride (Ephesians 5:25); and

WHEREAS, the New Testament Church also is referred to as the flock and Christ as the Shepherd (Luke 12:32; John 10:1-5; 7-18; 24-29; Hebrews 13:20; 1 Peter 2:25; 5:4); and

WHEREAS, Jesus declared that He lays down His life for His sheep (John 10:11); and

**WHEREAS**, the leaders of the local church are charged with caring for and protecting "all the flock" placed under their oversight (John 21:15-19; Acts 20:28-30) and maintaining purity among the relationships within the body of believers (Ephesians 5:3; Hebrews 13:4); and

WHEREAS, protection from false doctrines is commanded (Matthew 15:9; Acts 20:28-30), the local church also must guard against sexual abuse as well as physical and emotional violence in the congregation (Malachi 2:16; Matthew 15:19; Galatians 5:19-21), deliver victims of such predatory behavior to safety (Proverbs 24:11-12), as well as reject all inappropriate sexual behavior (1 Corinthians 5:1; 1 Corinthians 7:2); now therefore be it

**RESOLVED,** that we, the messengers to this 172nd session of the Louisiana Baptist Convention, meeting in Alexandria, Louisiana, November 11-12, 2019, do condemn as sin all inappropriate sexual behavior, all sexual abuse, all physical and emotional violence, as well as tolerance of all such behaviors; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that we reject any inaction with regard to the rescue of victims or the implementation of safeguards to protect against sexual abuse or physical or emotional violence, or, any failure to address inappropriate sexual behavior; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that we urge victims and witnesses to step forward and report to the congregation as well as civil authorities any instance of sexual abuse, physical or emotional violence, as well as any inappropriate sexual behavior; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that we urge congregations to develop policies as well as to create a work and ministry environment to guard against sexual abuse, physical or emotional violence, and inappropriate sexual behavior (background checks on staff and volunteers, and, openness to receive expressions of concerns or actual complaints), and, to establish reporting procedures to alert leaders, notify the congregation and inform civil authorities; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that we urge churches to minister to victims of any predatory behavior within the congregation, helping to counsel and nurture them spiritually and as otherwise needed; and be it further

**RESOLVED**, that we urge church leaders to conduct church discipline with regard to perpetrators of sexual abuse or of physical or emotional violence, as well as concerning participants in inappropriate sexual behavior; and be it finally

**RESOLVED**, that we urge Louisiana lawmakers to provide legal relief for churches to allow them the freedom to share information reasonably believed to be a true allegation about an individual to prospective employers or other congregations – as a means to prevent predators from continuing to harm others.




