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How to focus on what your members will learn and not on what you will teach

Bloom's Three Domains of Learning

There are 3 primary levels of learning. As a teacher, your task is to lead your Bible study class/group through these three levels, as found in Acts 2:37 (NKJV) -

"Now when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, "Men and brethren, what shall we do?"



Here is a four-step process to help you accomplish this.

PAST

Hook – Be creative and get the attention of your members. This will set the stage for the rest of your lesson and allow their interests/needs to surface.

Book – Involve your students in the study of the passage. This will help clarify meaning and communicate its principles.

Look - Relating the Bible to our lives helps students find their connections to its passages.

Took - Giving students the opportunity to identify out-of-class application of truth to life will lead them to specific actions of life change and allow meaningful completion of the lesson.
