More on Our 2017 Annual Meeting. We were reminded the two best ways to gain entrance into villages and communities where Jesus is not known is through medical and agricultural missions. A substantial number of our missionaries around the world are now doing some agriculturally related work (including provision of pure water) that improves health, models the love of Jesus, and opens doors for the gospel. Our missionaries also focus on social injustice that helps reduce human trafficking and suffering.

Our Alternative to ISIS. Some of the work we support is in Muslim communities, which provides opportunities to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ who taught us to love our neighbors as ourselves. Our projects provide a very different perspective from the radical Islamic message provided by a small segment of the Muslim population. Though we do not have projects in Bangladesh, Baptist Missionaries there report that Muslims in that country recently beheaded three national Christian pastors. Love, not hate, is the solution to the strong rhetoric being spread by many followers of Allah. All projects that we sponsor are integrated with activities of our International Mission Board.

Plans for 2018 Annual Meeting. The leadership of your Fellowship is already making plans for the 2018 annual meeting that will be held in the Bethel Baptist Church of West Monroe on Saturday, January 27, 2018. The pastor, Dr. Dennis Hensley, has a fervent passion for missions. He has placed a large glass jug on the platform near the pulpit with a sign that reads, "Change for goats." Their goal is to collect \$2,000 in coins during 2017. A goat can save the lives of an entire family by providing milk, cheese, and yogurt, as well as meat from male offspring.

Most of the funds collected for the goat project are provided by children of the church, which promotes a passion for missions and for helping people who are both poor in body and in spirit. This is a model that other churches, Sunday school classes, and organizations can use to promote mission awareness.

The Greatest Need of Your Fellowship. It should not surprise anyone that our greatest need is for additional members who have a heart for missions and for helping those who are desperately poor improve their status, both in this world and in the eternity to follow. Please promote the work of your Fellowship. Feel free to make copies of this Newsletter and distribute to those who might become interested in helping us help those who are often powerless to help themselves.

Funds for projects are assigned to areas where the darkness is greatest, that is, where the gospel has not gone before, and where despair and hopelessness are all too prevalent. We hope you will consider promoting meetings in your church to which representatives of your Fellowship can be invited to make presentations to explain the vital role of agricultural missions.
