Mission Center

The Hendrick Mission Center (HMC) consists of two air-conditioned dorms for housing up to a total of 160 people (80 male and 80 female). With a kitchen, dining room, and recreation areas, there is comfort away from home. We are located on 2.5 acres of land in Brownsville, TX, just 15 minutes from three bridges that cross the Rio Grande, from Texas into Mexico.

Cost

Our standard trip is \$175.00 per week with arrival Sunday evening and departure Friday morning. We provide three meals a day, plus one on Sunday and one on Friday.

Mission Trip Opportunities

PUSH Projects:

A mission trip centered on evangelism to help SBTC church plants "Push back the darkness" in their designated areas. This trip starts with training which teaches you how to share the gospel using "Creation to Christ" and is suitable for new believers and mature believers alike. We will also train you on how to start bible studies for discipleship with new believers. Once training is complete, several evangelism events, such as door-to-door or park evangelism begins, so as to put into practice what has been learned.

Construction and Service Projects:

With First Baptist Church's connection with many churches, pastors, missionaries and orphanages in both the Rio Grande Valley and Mexico, a variety of work projects small or large in scale can be tailored to the skills of your group. They can also be scheduled for however many hours desired.

Backyard Bible Club/VBS:

Backyard Bible Clubs or VBS's are some more opportunities available at our partner churches, parks, or in apartment complexes. These can be done in the morning or evening and could be paired with a work project or sports clinic.

Evangelistic Sports Clinic:

Opportunities to host soccer clinics or other sports clinics at partner churches, parks, or apartment complexes with a focus of sharing the gospel is another fun mission trip option. These can be done during the day or in the evening and paired with a work project or a Backyard Bible club/VBS in the evening.

Rio Grande Valley

The Rio Grande Valley is one of the poorest areas in the continental United States with Brownsville-Harlingen being the poorest Metropolitan area in the continental US, and Cameron County is one of the poorest counties in the continental US.
