Progress Reports from two projects your Fellowship supported in Myanmar in 2020 are shown below.

Update from the Living Waters Project: The tightest Covid restrictions of anywhere in the country were imposed in our state. Full and open travel was allowed only for a total of 3 weeks during the Covid clampdown. Despite the challenges of ministry and development work under the onslaught of Covid, we rejoice in the good work done. In our water development work, the second water cistern was completed. Repeated emergency water runs into the rugged hill areas were made bringing much needed assistance to drought-stricken villages, tiding them over until the rains came. Our initial plans to expand to a new area by partnering with a Christian clinic for water filter distribution had to be altered due to Covid. But we continued to offer water filters in our own target impact areas.
While Covid restricted certain aspects of our ministry, it also opened additional doors. The shutdown of the state impacted farmers and their families with the shuttering of markets, the closure of roads, and the forced quarantining of people. Therefore, food relief was both an urgent need and an opportunity for development and Gospel sharing.
Thank you for your partnership with us. We are deeply appreciative of the role the Louisiana Ag Fellowship has made through your partnership with our team, as well as globally through the other ministries you are supporting. May the Lord bless you.

Update from the Bhama Team: I regret to inform you that we had to cancel the order to purchase the soil scanner due to the uncertain situation in this country. While we were in discussion about the scanner, there seemed to be progress toward freedom from Covid and so we hoped to receive the soil scanner. But two
months later, there was an explosion of virus cases and our judgment proved wrong. So, to wisely steward every penny of God's money, we decided to cancel the order and our plans with the soil scanner because of lengthening virus restrictions. Now, in God's providence, we see this more clearly as the best decision because currently, our country is experiencing a military coup. Because of this, there is no longer any opportunity for agricultural work. We apologize for this and are grateful to all the people that so generously supported the project here.
